# **Developments at Brainhouse**

## Making a real difference

We have managed to make a substantial difference to two of our students over the last 6 months. Maggie suffered substantial burns to her head, neck and shoulders a few years back, she has

undergone extensive plastic surgery to straighten her neck, to free the muscles and to start allowing hair to grow. It was an absolute delight to see her playing football and volleyball with complete confidence and ease whilst out there in August. She wrote a beautiful thank you letter to us and with in it she said '*I can now play, read and write as others do without any aching in my head. I can now look back and turn my head without any problems and no pain. I feel great and I am just so happy about you people who have helped me' Maggie* 



Our little Emma, many of you will know struggled to hear and had no speech, given the problems she had with an underdeveloped sinus. Thanks to the support from the NHS here we were able to provide her with hearing aids and last month she had surgery to correct her sinuses. Emma is now taking full part in classroom work and is speaking – it was such a privilege to see the positive impact we have had on her life when out there in August.

### We have power

Thanks to the wonderful donation of solar panels from Mitibushi Electric, we are installing sun generated power into Brainhouse Academy.

### **Current Development Programmes and volunteer visits**

A volunteer group left on the 20 October for Brainhouse Academy, a mixture of new and established volunteers. Key aims being to install a solar power system, a new water tank and eventually a pump to bring water up from an underground source. The group is also painting of part of the school, moving the farm into more sustainable tyres than the sack farm created last year, and providing more arts and craft opportunities for the students to explore and enjoy. A lot to work on in a short time but we will do it in collaboration the staff at Brainhouse to ensure sustainability into the future.

The Midlands Guide's Leadership and Development Programme is well on the way now, with the members of the team selected, training dates established and the visit to Nairobi booked for Easter. We are looking forward to an exciting and challenging learning period over the next 10 months as these young woman, who will lead the Guiding movement of the future, raise funds and plan their projects to enhance the lives of our youngsters at Brainhouse.
