Last year we focused on customer service and improving our ability to counsel veterans and families on a myriad of needs through a variety of services. Always at the core of our efforts is to live the motto, "Beacon of Support."



I am extremely proud of our accomplishments as a veteran service organization and community collaborator, specifically, our implementation of the Service to Career Program in cooperation with the Pikes Peak Workforce Center. In this effort, we were able to implement a successful internship program, a job coaching and placement program and a very productive partnership with PrepConnect 360, helping veterans routinely transition through a highly productive seminar.

Our Veterans Family Resource Center featured more supportive services, including a Second Chance Housing Program to assist veterans with housing assistance at all levels. Of note, was the implementation of an emergency housing unit adjacent to the campus in coordination with one of our partners, Greccio Housing. This project was further sponsored by Five Star Bank and ENT Credit Union, two of our exceptional partners. It was a privilege to see firsthand that we could meet the needs of several veterans with immediate housing.

Also a great source of pride this year was our ever-expanding Behavioral Health Counseling Center. This program is very important as we are able to provide low cost/no cost counseling in an expedient manner. Our partners were able to refer many in need of these services. Our partners in this endeavor have simply been remarkable, representing several universities and colleges throughout the region. We were able to increase our services by 300%.






It can be difficult to remain at a duty station instead of going home for the holidays. The University of Colorado at Colorado Springs recognizes that many soldiers face this hardship. UCCS provided packages to single soldiers at Fort Carson who remained on post for the holiday season. Mt. Carmel was provided 40 care packages to distribute to soldiers.

In partnership with 4kidzsports and the 12 Days of Christmas Campaign, 12 military families were supported with over \$1,200 in funds contributed by

local businesses and other organizations.





#### **Exciting Program Updates**

The Employment & Transition Team had a great year in 2017 and is looking forward to another in 2018!

After one complete year, Service to Career has proven to be extremely beneficial to Veterans and family members in the Pikes Peak region. The team was able to place 38 personnel in paid internships. Of the 32 that have completed their internships, 27 were offered employment. PrepConnect 360 was able to provide 173 people the skills and networking required for their job searches. Job coaching resulted in 96 participants being placed in employment and an additional 31 supported with marketable training.



At this time, we would like to wish the best of luck to Chip Underwood and Christina Martinez. Chip will be moving on to another position, and Christina will be deploying with the Air Force Reserve. We would also like to congratulate Janet Farley, as she has earned her place on the team. All three have been instrumental in the success of the Service to Career Program.

The Veterans Integration Program has assisted 198 personnel with meaningful employment. The Peer Navigators have exceeded their goal almost three months ahead of schedule!
