AdFest National Conference DRILL toolkit launch...



We launched the DRILL Self-advocacy project toolkit at AdFest!

We hope that the toolkit will help people with learning disabilities track self-advocacy projects and to monitor project successes.



The tool kit includes a set of prompting cards to help people develop ideas for projects around key issues such as self advocacy, hate crime and better health services.



The tool kit was developed with the help and support of a range of organisations, led by All Wales People First, including Barod CIC, independent researchers, People First groups across Wales and representatives from statutory services in Wales.



Funding for the tool kit was a £40,000 grant through DRILL (Disability Research on Independent Living and Learning), a £5 million programme funded by the National Lottery.







Our group in Merthyr is now meeting regularly but we still need to get reps from Merthyr on decision making forums across Cwm Taff.




We have got a reserve representative onto the Public Services Board.

Anglesey






We had a first meeting about getting people involved in our

The plans for the training were put together by Caerphilly People First and Hayley Gray and David Williams from the Gwent Regional Partnership Team.


The first training sessions took place at Pontnewydd Priary School in Cwmbran on 18th and 19th October 2018, and the training was carried out by Caerphilly People First members Ffion Bethell and Kath Toms, with support from staff member Christy Taylor. The team trained over 200 pupils aged 7-11

We hope that the outcome of the training will be that young people will become more aware of the issues faced by people with learning disabilities, and gain an understanding of the issues they face in their lives.



The training will be ongoing and there are many more sessions planned for the future in other schools.
