## **Rationale**

- Our Pupil premium grant allocation has decreased slightly from last year at £53,100.
- This funding is to cover a range of support and interventions as specified in the provision section.
- Monitoring of the progress of individual children shows that there are a range of barriers to learning.
- These include, low attendance, limited parental support and engagement, difficulty concentrating in whole class settings, particular Special Needs and a lack of resilience.
- The impact of the measures put in place to support the children are monitored through a range of assessments that include the use of our INCERTs assessment system, regular testing, work scrutiny and staff observations.
- This is recorded for identified children in termly case studies and the progress of all Pupil premium children is monitored by a small Governors panel alongside the Leadership team.
- The formal tracking and monitoring of all Pupil Premium pupils takes place termly. The interventions are monitored by support staff and are linked to the Annual Appraisal process.
- The Pupil Premium strategy is reviewed annually in July when the summative assessment data is discussed.
