a guide to renovating glassware with liquid renovate

Glasses should be renovated on a regular basis and as a guide that should be carried out every 2 months. Liquid renovate not only cleans the glasses it also acts as a steriliser inside the cabinet which will help remove yeast and protein build up. New glasses should also be renovated before use.

If your glasses show any of the following signs, you may need to renovate:

- Moisten a serviette and wipe the inside of a newly cleaned pint glass, if you have a brown deposit showing then you have protein building up on the glass.
- Look at the underside of a pint glass around the outer ring of the base, poor results will be magnified and show up as a brown 'halo'. The white logo of a 'Headkeeper' will turn brown.
- If there is a film of bubbles on the inside of a lager glass then it is a sure sign that the glass is not clean. The bubbles will only stick to an impurity.
- As the glasses are taken from the Glasswasher they will appear with "raindrops on the windowpane" effect and the water is not 'sheeting' off the glass.

You should also check for signs inside your glasswasher:

• Wild Yeast. Look for beige or even black film or deposit (build up of growing yeast cells) around the door and door hinges. If this exists then it will transfer to all of the glasses and give poor results. The liquid renovate will also serve to sterilise the cabinet of the glasswasher.

How to use Liquid Renovate

- Remove the detergent tube from the existing 5ltr container and replace the original screw cap.
- Place the detergent tube into the 5ltr container of Liquid Renovate.
- It may take up to 6 washes for Liquid Renovate to enter the wash tank.
- Load the glasses into the basket and wash in the normal manner. There may be an aroma of Chlorine (Bleach) in the atmosphere but there will not be any chemicals left on the glass as long as the glasswasher is operating properly.
- Renovate should be left on the machine until the glasses are clean and the water sheets off the glass (no raindrops). This will usually take about 2-3 days over busy periods (weekends).
- When renovation has been completed, the original glasswasher detergent should be re-installed.

If after renovating, your glasses are still poor and they look cloudy, then this could be down to minerals in your water drying on the glass. A suitable water softener with regular monitoring will remove the limescale and calcium deposits and reduce scale build up inside the machine. Both machine and glasses will need less maintenance and you will see noticeable differences. You may even have a fault with your machine, get your glasswasher regularly checked, it will save you money in the long run.
