CATHEDRAL PRECINCTS PARKING: It is good to see significant progress in the Canterbury Journey Landscaping project as well as the building of the new Welcome Centre. There continue to be restrictions on the number of car parks available in the Precincts. Parking for Cathedral Services will be on the main (Oaks) car park, but this is very limited and cannot be guaranteed. Once it is full, our Constables will guide congregation members to use public car parks. We would like to remind those who do find a space on the Oaks to remove their cars promptly afterwards to make room for others coming later.
