Lucy Hinksman, Chair of the National Council opened the conference.


Joe Powell, National Director, showed a film of the growing threats to self-advocacy in Wales. The threats included

- Austerity and cuts to local authority funding.
- The political climate; it's claimed that the current UK governments treatment of disabled people is illegal.
- Third sector funding is harder to get for the core purposes of self-advocacy groups.

Joe called for groups to work together and learn from each other. He urged groups to get organised and strong, with good governance and informed members.

Joe gave a promise that All Wales People First will always listen to members and asked groups to be honest with All Wales People First.

Joe Powell played the Devil's Advocate and stirred up conversation with statements he has heard about self-advocacy

- People First what's the point now that the Wellbeing act says everyone should be listened to anyway?
- People First it's just a new type of day centre!
- Members need staff, or it would all fall apart!

- My local group don't help me, what can AWPF do about it?
- Self-advocacy groups are dying we need to find another way!
- There's no money left!

More self-advocates and staff from self-advocacy groups joined the conversation.

Matthew and Rebecca will use the report to focus their work over the next year and to help AWPF plan how they support groups across Wales.




