Achieving Greatness

IN MARK 9:35-37 Jesus spoke to his disciples about how to achieve true greatness. True greatness, he said, comes not by striving to be first but by being willing to be last. It is achieved not by positioning oneself to receive the praise of others, but by serving others—by seeking to be a blessing to as many people as possible.

Jesus illustrated his point by talking about serving children. Why? The discussion wasn't initially centered on children. Why did Jesus bring children into the picture?

The answer is that there is no payback from serving children. They're unable to repay us and they don't generally tell others about the greatness of our service to them. They just want someone to take care of them. They don't make a big deal out of the fact that we've poured out our lives for them. Children prove more clearly than

older people whether or not we are truly great—whether we live to serve or to be praised.

We might have expected Jesus to say something like this: "Now here's a child—someone you may not think is worth your time. But children *are* worth your time. They are

significant. When you serve a child, you are serving someone who is just as valuable as the emperor." But that's not what he said. Instead, he turned the discussion from the value of a child to the value of God himself

The Bible exalts God first and foremost. When we serve children who are in great need, we do so not for our own



glory but for the glory of God.
