The Annual Parish Meeting APM - The APM is scheduled for Tuesday 17th April at 7.30 in the Village Hall. This is the opportunity for all parishioners to attend and raise any matters with the Parish Council. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

New Homes Bonus Questionnaire: The New Homes Bonus questionnaire delivered with the village newsletter received a poor overall response with only 123 questionnaires returned. The analysis of the returns confirms 88% in support for the Community Centre funding and a small interest in sport and play facilities. It is considered the result will enable the full New Homes Bonus to be allocated for funding the Community Centre. A big thank you to all those who responded.

Double Yellow Lines: The request to Cllr Alastair Adams for installing double yellow lines on the bend in High Street was declined by the County Highways officer as there are no recorded accidents in the last two years. The Parish Council are not in agreement with the officer's decision and requested a site meeting with Cllr Alastair Adams, the County Highways officer and parish councillors who will gather photographic evidence of the parking problems.

Traffic Speed Data: Traffic data information from the speed monitoring carried out on Bretforton Road in January indicated there is insufficient speed limit abuse to request any speed enforcement or speed reduction measures. The mean speed recorded for the week of monitoring was recorded as 31.9mph Eastbound and 25.7mph Westbound. The Council agreed no further action will be taken on requesting enforcement but will site the VAS in the area to remind drivers of speed limit abuse. Anyone requiring the full data set, contact the Clerk.

The Parish Council meets on the 2nd Tuesday of each month. Members of the public are welcome to attend meetings, which are held in the Village Hall and commence at 7.15 pm. 

News from your District Councillor & County Councillor Alastair Adams Honeybourne News edition – April 2018

Dear Resident, Wishing you all a very Happy Easter.

In early March I was in Barcelona to watch my eldest son George run in the marathon. Over 20,000 people attempted to run the 42.2 km, and he finish it in 3 hours 46 minutes – a personal best for him. I was a proud Dad, but I felt exhausted just walking from one point of the circuit to the other to cheer him on! But what a contrast in the weather, I left Spain with temperatures in the 20's, and landed back in the UK at minus 5degrees and snow! Well the good news is Spring is here, and the warmer and longer days are coming.

But Spring also brings WCC Highways road & pavement maintenance works, and there will be a lot of improvements to our roads and footways over the next few months which is a good thing. However in the short term there will be road closures and traffic lights which we all hate. We like the end result but not the short term pain! However I thought I would remind you that not all road works are caused by your County Council, and there are 4 main reasons why traffic lights and road closures occur, and one that is specific to the A46:

1. Emergency works by the utilities company such as burst mains water, leaking gas pipes, and faulty electricity or telephone cables. For example Post Street was closed in March because of a burst mains pipe.

2. Planned improvements by the utilities companies – a big programme around here has been upgrading the Broadband by installing fibre cable which has dug up a lot of roads! Also the Network Rail can be classed as a utility and they are doing a lot of maintenance repair work to the railway bridges.

3. New development works – this is where new houses or commercial buildings are being built and the connections to the sewers, water, electricity and gas need to be made and the connections are often in the road. An example of this is the closure of Offenham Rd this month. These works are organised by the developer of the site like Bovis or Taylor Wimpy or Cala Homes.

4. Worcestershire County Council maintenance and improvements to the roads and footways. This is where your roads and pavements are being resurfaced, or surface dressed, new kerbs or pedestrian crossings are being installed to improve them for your use.

5. Highways England is responsible for the A46 as it is a trunk road. Highways England is a National organisation that maintains all motorways and trunk roads, and they organise the maintenance of the A46 so they are improving the Evesham by pass this month.

Here is the list of work to our roads around the area in March/April, and other Highways related works

1. Stratford Road Honeybourne - Road closure application on behalf of Worcestershire county council - 14.04.18 - 22.04.18 – pavement and roadworks

2. Raised Pavement near the Gate – due to be repaired by end of March

3. Entrance into the Honeybourne News shop patched - this has been done, but the pavement all the way to opposite the Mickleton Rd will be re-surfaced soon

4. Closure of Offenham Rd to install a new storm drain – the closure of the Offenham Rd has now been from 2nd April till 22 April, then traffic lights from 23rd April to 14th May, and then traffic lights from 16th May until 6th June.

5. Repairs and re-tarmacking of footways Blacksmith Rd, South Littleton are planned in March/April

6. A46 Evesham Bypass Closed overnight in both directions 12th March to 30th March by Highways England, 8pm to 6am.

7. 10mph Convoy Working B4085 Birmingham Road, Badsey -for re-tarmacking in the first week of April – should only take one day.

8. Under the bridges towards Honeybourne Road Closure C2049 Stratford Road, Honeybourne - 23/04 - 27/04 Night Works 23:00 - 06:00

9. No ditch down on eastern side Buckle Street just before the junction with Shinehill Lane – WDC flood engineers and Highway inspectors visited Honeybourne to inspect this and look at ways to prevent water running down the road. Proposals being investigated.

10. Public footpath - PROW 540c China Corner – to Grange Farm Taylor Wimpy site. Countryside Services have offered to meet with Taylor Wimpy to agree the position and resurfacing of this path

11. Weed killing – I have also sent a reminder to all local parish councils to use their lengthsman to kill weeds on pavements and kerbs.

As always, if you have any issues on any Highways matters, please report it on the WCC website http://www.worcestershire.gov.uk/homepage/98/report_it Also remember a photo of the Highways problem is as good as "a thousand words" so always take a photo where possible.

Council Tax 2018/19 - Each household in Honeybourne should have received their local tax demand in March which is made up of five different bodies; the County Council, the District Council, the Parish Council, the Police, and the Fire & Rescue Services. Each of these can decide their own increase so when you get you council tax demand in March 2018, you will see the breakdown between these organisations.

New CEO at Worcestershire County Council – The new CEO Paul Robinson has started early because of the sad news that the interim CEO Steve Stewart who joined the Council in May of last year, died suddenly on the night of 28th Feb.

Visit to Kanes Foods - I visited Kanes Foods in Littleton, and met the new MD with several members of other Parish Councils, on 23rd February. Kanes is one of the biggest employers in Wychavon, employing nearly 2000 people at peak times, and they supply salad bags, and stir fry ingredients to most of the supermarkets. Although you can see little of their premises, they are very environmentally conscious, and their huge factory has a grass roof, and there is a large natural trail that schools and community organisations are welcome to visit. They are also taking on apprentices especially students in engineering – see http://kanesfoods.co.uk/

Resurrecting meetings of the VFQP Working Group - Vale of Evesham Freight Quality Partnership – I have written to various local companies and organisations requesting their help in re-starting the VFQP. Getting all the HGV users and the Police and the three County Councils and Freight Transport Association around the table at least once a year to discuss issues will help the local roads and hopefully improve the network.

Planning Application 17/02263/FUL Land At Perrie Drive, Honeybourne for nine new dwellings – Because of changes proposed by the developer, a second public consultation occurred in March. Although is now closed, the decision has still not yet been made, so you may still have time to object to it. You can write your comments on the planning portal https://plan.wychavon.gov.uk/ and type in the reference 17/02263. I strongly oppose this application as it will remove the green open space that has been used by residents for many years. I am pleased to see so many

residents have already written into oppose this application, but the more the better. Please help protect our open spaces by opposing this application.

Superfast Broadband to Ullington & Buckle Street - Ullington residents should now be able to sign up for Superfast Broadband Litter Pick. Thank you to the Honeybourne residents who contacted me last month and volunteered to join a community litter pick. We are now looking for someone to lead this community litter pick, and we really need a few more volunteers too. Can you help? If so, please contact me at adams.pebworth@gmail.com WDC have agreed to supply litter pickers (standard size, & extra long for ditches), gloves and high vis jackets all free of charge to help launch the Honeybourne Community Litter Pick.

Letter from the Vicar

NEW LIFE, NEW HOPE

It all seemed so hopeless on Good Friday. The Saviour promised by God had been crucified and was dead. So many hopes and dreams were shattered and lay in ruins. The disciples were bewildered and confused by what had happened. How could this possibly be part of God's plan to reconcile the whole of creation to Himself?

Christ's death, which is as significant and effective today as it was 2,000 years ago, and which will still be just as significant and effective in 2,000 years' time, was necessary because sin had driven a wedge between our relationship with the God who created us in His image and who longs to be in a relationship with each one of us. On the cross, all our sin – past, present and future – was put to death with Jesus and we have been forgiven.

And then this happened. Mary Magdalene arrived at the tomb where Christ's body had been buried, only to find it empty. St John writes,

'Mary Magdalene stood crying outside the tomb. She was still weeping, when she stooped down and saw two angels inside. The angels asked Mary, "Why are you crying?" She answered, "They have taken away my Lord's body! I don't know where they have put him." As soon as Mary said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there. But she did not know who he was. Jesus asked her, "Why are you crying? Who are you looking for?" She thought he was the gardener and said, "Sir, if you have taken his body away, please tell me, so I can go and get him." Then Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him, "Rabboni." The Aramaic word "Rabboni" means "Teacher."' (CEV)

The story of our salvation doesn't end with death. On what we now celebrate as Easter Day, Christians believe that Jesus Christ rose from the dead. In doing so, he destroyed eternal death and gave the whole of God's creation the opportunity to revel instead in eternal life. Those who believe, no matter how falteringly, have hope – hope for the here and now, and hope for eternity. This doesn't mean that we won't go through difficult times. It doesn't mean that won't know pain and suffering. It doesn't even mean that we'll escape physical death. What it does mean is that death, when it comes, is not the end of our journey, but, rather, the beginning of a new one in God's presence forever.

I pray that this Easter, amongst family gatherings and enjoying lots of Easter eggs, you will find time to draw real hope from the Easter story. Across the six parishes that I am privileged to care for, you will find services in our churches to help you do just that. We'd love you to join us, but, even if you don't want to, or aren't able to, may you know and experience the hope that Jesus Christ offers. There's nothing like it, and nothing so certain, this side of heaven.

A very happy Easter to you all.

A 5-Mile History Walk to Weston-sub-Edge

Sturdy shoes or boots are recommended. This route is clearly signed (signposts and waymarkers) Pets should be kept on leads at all times. Drinks and snacks are recommended.

Start at the The Gate Inn and cross the Weston Road (TAKE GREAT CARE) and walk up High Street to the Thatched Tavern. Then take the road alongside the Thatched Tavern into China Corner, walking straight-on until you pass through the narrow gap between the houses. This leads up to the Fair Acres estate. Turn right and follow the headland until you come to a metal gate (opposite the brambles concealing the pool which is the site of the Honeybourne murder in 1809). You can choose to pass through the gate and follow the path to the old chicken sheds in the distance at Weston Road, or continue on to pass over the bridge and then turn left along the headland to the Weston Road.

TAKE GREAT CARE when crossing the road. This is a very fast road, and visibility is not very good. Follow the grass verge to your right where, after 100 metres, you will join a footpath towards Weston Fields Farm. After 20 metres fork right to the stile opposite the farmhouse. Follow the path with the brook on your right, crossing two more stiles before coming to a gate that leads into the garden of Long Stretch Farm. Through this beautiful woodland garden before crossing over the brook bridge and through the step-through field gate to follow the path with the brook now on your left side. Over another stile, continuing to follow the brook until you meet a stile leading onto the dismantled railway (to the right of the brick culvert). Cross over the railway bed and through the gate into Gloucestershire.

Follow the path, moving towards the electric fence on your right. Do not attempt to cross this fence. With the fence on your right and the woodland on your left, walk straight ahead until you reach a pedestrian gate. Through the gate and then over a stile just past the dilapidated (extremely dangerous) wartime airfield buildings; follow the field edge with the stream on your left. Over another stile and ahead again until you reach the bridge on your left. The industrial estate you see to your right was part of RAF Honeybourne. It has been said that these buildings were used in the filming of some scenes from the BBC TV series "Tenko". Cross over the stream and then straight-across the woodland until you reach the next stile. With your back to the stile take a 2.30 o'clock direction to the next stile. Over the stile and follow the track to your right until you meet the main road in Weston-sub-edge. TAKE GREAT CARE to cross this road and continue ahead along Church Street until you reach Parsons Lane on your right, taking time as you pass under the large cedar tree to turn back to look at the barn with two white doors, noticing the fire-plate at the apex of the subscribers Policy, and there to remain so long as the Subscribers continue to pay their Quarteridges") above a stone dated 1857.

Walk down Parsons Lane past the old almshouses (Meon Cottage) until you reach the green footpath sign on your left. Along this footpath passing the 19th century water point. Turn left to follow the footpath between the gardens and out into the field. Continue to follow this path until you reach the bridge over the stream. Pass through the kissing gate onto the site of the moated manor. This manor was already owned by the Giffard family in 1279, when Walter Gifford (Archbishop of York) died, and it passed to his brother, Godfrey, Bishop of Worcester. Follow the path straight-ahead with the first telegraph pole and the moat on your left. Walk towards the far right-hand corner of this field until you reach the last telegraph pole. Turn left along the edge of the header pond. The medieval ponds are now clearly visible. Continue walking around the pond edge in the direction of the church. If you take a short detour on your left to the high ground you will have an excellent over-view of the site. It is interesting to note that when we experience flood conditions, this moat and the ponds are completely full of water.

When you reach the cemetery, pass through the kissing gate and on to the church door. Follow the path to the right until you reach the main gated entrance. Turn left into Church Street and, passing another 19th century water point, walk down to Parsons Lane. Now you can retrace your steps back to Honeybourne, perhaps stopping at the Seagrave Arms for refreshment.

We hope you have enjoyed your walk today, and that we have whetted your appetite for a variety of future walks during 2018* using the Public Rights of Way (PROWs) in the Parish of Honeybourne. There are two types of competition:

One Day Events: Angling (22.09.18); Bell Boating (23.06.18); Bowls (16.09.18); Cross Country (18/07/18); Men's 5-a-Side Football (01/07/18); Petanque (22/07/18); Rounders (08/07/18); Junior and Senior Table Tennis (07.10.18).

Knock-Out Events: Crib; Ladies' Darts; Men's Darts; Dominoes; Pool; Skittles. These start in August and continue through to their Finals which are held in the autumn.

Engraved Trophies, many of which have been in existence since the start of the Games, are awarded to the Winners and Runners Up in each Event with the much-coveted Silver Salver being awarded to the overall Winning Parish. These Trophies, as well as a number of others, are given out at the annual Presentation Night hosted by the previous year's overall Winning Parish; this year, this will be held at Bretforton Sports Club in November.


