## Course content

Internal units will be graded with the overall BTEC Grade assessed as Pass (C grade), Merit (B grade), Distinction (A grade) and Distinction\* (A\* grade).

## Assessment

External and internal assessment: the on-going assessment allows students to analyse and improve their own performance through their course. This teacher assessment is complemented by an external assessment to give a clear and robust view of a student's real abilities and performance.
