25 states will include imperiled bumble bees, 42 states will include dragonflies, and 10 states will include freshwater mussels in their lists of Species of Greatest Conservation Need based upon input from Xerces.







The Xerces Society continues to produce publications and resource materials in support of invertebrate conservation. In 2015 we continued to expand upon our focus on roadsides as opportunities for pollinator habitat, and published several ground breaking conservation guides and scientific reports.
