## Dale hosts spectacular 'Waterfall' illuminations...

For six nights in October dramatic cubes of over 1800 people came to cascading water. Bowlees to view the spectacular light installation created by Teesdale based artist. Steve Messam.

Over the summer, Steve had filmed Teesdale's famous waterfalls of Cauldron Snout, High Force and Low Force and the slow motion, high definition footage was projected onto all four sides of three whitewashed Raby Estate barns, transforming them into

Stunning night-time conditions saw a glowing Hunters Moon on the first weekend and starlit skies the following weekend, complete with Milky Way.

Visitors came from far and wide some travelling from as far as Hull, Leeds, Newcastle and Oxford especially for the installation, having seen it on BBC News.



### **NE First Credit Union Opportunities at UTASS**

#### Did you know you can join NE First Credit Union and pay in to your account via UTASS?

Adults can join the credit union for a £1 fee and can now apply immediately for a loan up to a maximum of £15,000. Loan interest rates are calculated daily on a reducing balance basis. There is also free life insurance with every loan. Young people can also save with the credit union and they do not pay any joining fee. Young savers aged under 8 years also receive a free piggy bank.

# Buiness Unit at TTASS

#### Pip - Unit 5 - Steve Messam

An environmental artist based in the North of England. With his site-specific installations, he sets visual accents in rural or urban settings, which include historical relics and vacant architecture

that make us perceive the familiar environment in a new way.

Steve's next project will be to transform three simple whitewashed barns into a unique and stunning artwork called Waterfall which will run across 14-16 and 21-23 October.

Waterfall is part of Durham County Council's fresh approach to visual

arts and this remarkable artwork will draw on the rich history, geography and characteristics of the area around it. Steve will film each of the waterfalls of the River Tees - Cauldron Snout, High Force and Low Force - in high definition, slow motion video. The films will then be projected onto all four sides of three whitewashed barns that cascade down the hillside to the east of Bowlees Visitor Centre, effectively wrapping them in mesmerising slow motion pulses of water.

Waterfall has been organised by Durham County Council in association with North Pennines AONB Partnership and is produced by kind permission of Raby Estates.

Pictured opposite are the two trainees during their Lantra 13-16 Tractor Driving on 23<sup>rd</sup> July and Julia along with Lantra trainer, Terry Maw, who has been delivering this excellent training for over 9 years at UTASS.

We would like to express our most grateful thanks to The Sir Tom Cowie Charitable Trust for funding over the last 3 years to cover the cost of training courses for young drivers, which has been of enormous benefit to our community, improving knowledge and skills and enhancing job prospects.

This training can now continue, thanks to one year's funding from The Wellesley Trust Fund at the Community Foundation Tyne & Wear and will again provide for car & trailer lessons, car driving lessons, quad bike or pre-test tractor training and Lantra 13-16 tractor driving. An application form for future applicants to complete can be downloaded from our website or posted out from our Office, although currently there is only an odd space left for Lantra 3-15 Tractor Driving & Quad Bike training. Please see the "Training Opportunities" tab on our website.

For this course the tractor & trailer was kindly loaned by Lloyd Limited, Bishop Auckland and venue kindly provided by Barnard Castle Auction Mart, with assistance from John & Fay Hutchinson and other UTASS Members.



Weardale Rural Skills Training

So far 9 trainees have been part funded by Weardale Action Partnership for their NPTC Safe Use of Pesticides training & assessment (March & August); 2 more for the Semex DIY Artificial Insemination for Cattle (June); 2 for British Wool Marketing Board Sheep Shearing (June); 7 for Lantra Chainsaw training (June & November) 1 for trailer lessons; 3 for NPTC City & Guilds Level 2 Award in Land-based Forklift Truck Operations (September) pictured opposite at Westgate.

Two trainees have also been fully funded for an Emergency First Aid Course (23 November); with relevant modules for "Emergency First Aid for Farmers" and "Emergency First Aid for Sport and Exercise".

There has also been interest in drystone walling training. All training is arranged when there are sufficient numbers coming forward to run a course, so please get in touch to let us know of your training requirements. #### Educational Links

A Big Thank You - when the final funding from the Heart of Teesdale was used as Woodland School visited Middleton Mart on 20 September. Over 2 years, 11 primary schools and 357 children have visited with transport arranged, plus funding for four educational banners (pictured in Open Evening images). Funding for these visits has enabled primary school children in Teesdale to study curriculum related aspects of the farming year – thanks go too, to Middleton Mart. HOT have subsidised by 50% trainees' costs to attend the British Wool Marketing Board Shearing Courses for 2015+2016. Funding in February covered transport costs for shearing trainees & UTASS members to visit the BWMB Depot in Bradford where they learned about grading, saw a live Auction, as well as visiting the nearby Haworth Scouring Plant to see scouring, carding and combing processes and Enco Global Testing Services at the site.

#### Open Evening at Middleton Mart & Minibus Celebration

Held on Thursday, 8<sup>th</sup> September at Middleton Mart from 6pm till 8pm, with activities mostly evolving from requests from the young people from outlying areas who attend the UTASS Drop In on Thursday evenings - we offered a warm welcome to many community members too. Activities for all ages – including a kids corner!! Trainees who have passed their D1 Minibus Test so that they can drive a minibus like our "Asda Minibus", thanks to the two year Teesdale Action Partnership funded project, were invited to attend as special quests.

The two year Minibus Project, delivered by UTASS, has been funded thanks to Teesdale Action Partnership and 7 trainees have now got D1 on their licence and another 3 have passed their Theory Test and are ready to progress to lessons. The Minibus Safety Awareness qualification (Midas) has also been achieved by 14 volunteer drivers who already had D1 on their licence.

UTASS's new, smaller, 10 seater "Dot Minibus" (funded by the Department of Transport) arrived on 14 October!! Unlike our existing 15 seater minibus, it can be driven by younger drivers, using their normal car licence, who passed their test after 1.1.97.

Our Asda minibus, driven by volunteers, also did the usual route up the Dale to collect and return passengers for the Open Evening and if your community organisation would like to use of either of our minibuses to transport your members, please view our website for a Vehicle User Form to download outlining requirements <a href="http://utass.org/minibus-training/">http://utass.org/</a> minibus-training/ We would be delighted to hear from you and answer any queries!
