More than 1.000 people took part in the 5K obstacle bubble rush course that took place at Leazes Park, Richardson Road, Newcastle earlier this year.


Rachel joined others wading through a sea of foam before being bombarded by different coloured bubble stations, with cannons creating a 4ft bubble bath to run through.
