



School Vision

Barningham CEVC Primary School: **To learn, aspire, believe and hope through our Christian faith.**

The targeted and strategic use of pupil premium will support us in achieving our vision.

Pupil Premium at our school includes Free School Meal (FSM), Children in Care (CiC) and Service Children.

Principles

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils;
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed;
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged;
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged;
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time.

Provision

The range of provision the Governors may consider making for this group could include:

- Reducing class sizes thus improving opportunities for effective Assessment for Learning (AfL) and accelerating progress;
- Providing small group work with an experienced teacher focussed on overcoming gaps in learning;
- 1:1 support;
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through learning mentors, trained TAs or external agencies.

All our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress moving children to at least age related expectations. Initially this will be in communication, English and maths.

Pupil premium resources may also be used to target able children on FSM to achieve progress as required. Provision will not be aimed at children with an Education Health and Care Plan unless they meet the criteria for Pupil Premium.

Reporting

It will be the responsibility of the Head Teacher, or a delegated member of staff, to produce regular reports for the Governors' Learning and Achievement Committee on:

- the progress made towards narrowing the gap, by year group, for socially disadvantaged pupils;
- an outline of the provision that was made since the last meeting;
- an evaluation of the cost effectiveness, in terms of the progress made by the pupils receiving a particular provision, when compared with other forms of support;
- Governors will ensure that the school is publishing on-line how the pupil premium funding has been used and what the impact has been on learning, attainment and wellbeing of those pupils for whom it is intended.

It will be the responsibility of the Chairperson of the Learning and Achievement Committee to make sure this information is made known to the full governing body.

The Governors of the school will ensure that there is an annual statement to parents and carers on how the Pupil Premium funding has been used to address the issue of 'narrowing the gap', for socially disadvantaged pupils. This task will be carried out within the requirements published by the Department for Education.

Appeal

Any appeals against this policy will be through the Governor's Complaints Procedure
