Rural Residents Hit By Identity Fraud...

Last month several rural residents discovered that their identities were stolen via their mail being taken from their 'road ends'.

The fraudsters tried to access their personal bank accounts and also applied for numerous forms of credit in their names.

In one instance the fraudsters managed to get approximately £30,000 worth of credit accepted through various banks/providers.

Police are still investigating the matter, and further victims are still coming forward. If you think you may have been victim to



such crimes you should contact the police.

Many residents have a 'box' at the end of their drive, however their drive can often be a significant distance from their house. It's important to consider how safe and secure your 'post box' is, and ensure your mail is left in a secured box.

The room will be an area young people can relax and socialise with friends, as well as a base from which other activities can take place, such as mini bus outings, issue based projects and basically whatever the young people want to do! For example we have already welcomed Tariq from the Northern Heartlands project to our official opening on Thursday 3rd May, and young people heard how they could get involved in what promises to be an exciting creative project.

First floor facilities (pool table, computers, TV and sports area) are still available to those using the new lounge on a Thursday

evening from 7.30pm to 9pm. Anyone aged 12+ arriving by mini bus at 6pm will, as usual be welcome to come in and use the upstairs lounge while the younger members enjoy their session on the first floor.

were unable to offer a session for this age group.

The mini bus taxi continues to provide a reliable means of getting down the dale to join in. Pick-ups must be booked before 4pm on the day by phoning Charlotte in the UTASS office. Return trips leave UTASS at 7.30pm and 9pm.






UTASS have two wheelchair accessible minibuses available for community groups.

Are you looking for a new phone, broadband or TV deal?

It is often worth shopping around for deals when a contract comes to an end to check if you can pay less for the same or similar service with another provider.

A good way to find out what deals are available is to check out the price comparison sites which have been accredited by Ofcom who are the communications regulator in the UK. Other comparison sites and service providers are also available outside of the scheme.

The Ofcom price accreditation scheme logo is awarded to websites that have had their price comparison services put through a rigorous independent audit. The audit checks whether the information provided to consumers is accessible, accurate, transparent, comprehensive and up to date.

There are currently eight accredited comparison sites, detailed in the table below, that provide a variety of service comparisons.

You can complete a comparison yourself through the relevant website or over the phone.

Once you have an idea of what deals are available to you, it might also be worth contacting your current provider to check what they can offer you. If you find a cheaper deal for the same service with another provider, it

Unfortunately there were a lot more applications than spaces for the Trailer & Car Lessons, however due to this high demand, we applied



to a second funder and we are so grateful to The Hedley Foundation for providing more funding, with previous applicants for car lessons or trailer lessons not needing to reapply.

NPTC Level 2 Award in the Transport of Animals by Road (Short Journeys) — Cattle & Sheep are classed as one species. Although no training is required, those interested will receive information to prepare beforehand. Qualification handbook 600/0306/6 states "This qualification is aimed specifically at people transporting animals over 65Km and up to eight hours in duration, where the journey is in connection with an economic activity" This ties in with requirements for a business to apply for an Animal Transporter Authorisation for the above journeys, which is free of charge. This Animal Health and Plant Agency application form needs to be completed and returned to the Welfare in Transport Team at Carlisle and can be obtained from UTASS, or the links are on our Website
