## **Invaluable Volunteering**

As the Autumn is transitioning to Winter, after the first frosts of the year, we here at Pennine Lancashire Community Farm are reminded of how deeply grateful we are to a team of volunteers that turn out, whatever the weather, to keep our sites running. Their efforts are enormous, and would equate to over £376,000 annually of time, if paid at the national minimum wage.

A great example of such contributions can be seen at the new community garden space on Cog Lane, beside Parkside Methodist Church in Burnley which was opened on Monday October 30<sup>th</sup>. The refurbishment of the space was carried out by Pennine Lancashire Community Farm, with the help of volunteers, transforming "What was basically a piece of waste ground is now a neat set of allotment style plots, ready for planting" said Richard Hoyle, the lay pastor of Parkside.

A volunteer on the project, Daniel Kirkbride from Burnley, said "I helped put the woodchip down, paint the fences and put the soil in the beds, I was shown how to do it then got on with it myself. It keeps me busy, I learn new skills and help others".
