Dear Member,

We want to focus this month's contribution discussing the fundamental issue;

What does it mean to be a member of SEFF's Family Network?

Many of you reading this Newsletter have been involved with SEFF for many years but some will have joined more recently. Those who have been around for the duration will have seen the organisation grow and develop to a level that you probably would ever have envisaged. SEFF's Management are acutely aware that as these developments have occurred that there is an absolute necessity to retain the localism and friendly feel to the organisation.

In this regard we want to reassure all of you who reside in SEFF's original area of benefit (south Fermanagh and the wider County) that the Lisnaskea office continues to offer services, activities and support as it has done for almost two decades - nothing essentially has changed. However what we have done is develop our outreach services, replicating the model that we have developed for Fermanagh so that other innocent victims/survivors of terrorism might benefit - that has taken us to Newtownstewart, County Tyrone, Rathfriland, County Down, Bessbrook, South Armagh, London (to support GB-based victims/survivors) and indeed to the Republic of Ireland in support of those impacted living within that jurisdiction.

When dealing with issues of victims/survivors, the priority is not geography, nor the name of the organisation delivering the service - the priority is and MUST be supporting innocents who have been directly impacted as a result of the terrorist campaign. SEFF is not a community group, it is an organisation which support, campaigns and advocates for the innocent victims and survivors of terrorism and 'other Troubles related criminal violence.' We do have a remit to serve the wider community but this is in addition and compliments our core work.

Management has noticed in recent months that the level of attendance of local members to events held in Fermanagh has reduced and the impression is that some members are becoming service users of what the organisation offers as opposed to demonstrating commitment for those we represent as well as the broader contribution we are making as an organisation to the development of our Country.

Management appeals with you to make a special effort to attend our monthly member meetings (always held on the fourth Wednesday of the month) to attend our Annual Church Service, our AGM, the Educational/Cultural workshops etc. Essentially those events and meetings which discuss the work of SEFF.

As we write this we are mindful that many of you have given loyal service and support to the organisation down the years (whether as volunteers or members) and we do thank you for this. Rather we are appealing with all 1,300 members within our ranks to please help share the load. Come do your bit and be an intrinsic part of this organisation and family.

In conclusion we would wish to welcome Ernie Waterworth, Nevin Brown and Iona Boyd to the organisation and particularly, our Advocacy Service.

SEFF's Counselling Service

SEFF currently has availability for new people to be supported via the Counselling Service which is offered in our Manderwood Offices on Friday's.

The Service can prove to be a 'lifeline' for those who use it. The nature of the service is extremely confidential however a number of previous users have remarked upon the 'transforming effect' that the process has had upon their lives. They remarked that they feel more confident, that they feel more able and better equipped to face the future.

SEFF has an in-house Counsellor who has been with us for over 8 years - Helen Murphy is very much part of the SEFF family. Those who go to see Helen can be assured of 100% confidence, 100% professionalism and 100% be certain that she is someone who cares and who wants to help.

People see counsellors for a wide range of reasons - they may be dealing with problems such as unemployment, domestic violence, bereavement, trauma related to the Northern Ireland troubles, relationship problems or family conflicts. They may suffer from insomnia, stress, panic attacks or anxiety. Sorrow, pain, rejection, confusion or anger may be interfering with their day-to-day lives.

Accessing Counselling should not be viewed as a sign of weakness but rather as a 'sign of strength.' Acknowledging that we need support and help means that we can improve and become more at ease and at Peace with ourselves, avoidance of the problems can mean that resentments, anger and despair become embedded.

SEFF's 7th Annual Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving

SEFF held its' 7th Annual Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving took place in Templecarne Church of Ireland Parish, Pettigo, County Donegal on Sunday 6th October 2019.

This year's Service had the theme; Terrorism knows NO Borders with 27 new patches remembering 34 innocents of terrorism murdered in Northern Ireland, Republic of Ireland and Great Britain.

Speaking in the aftermath of the event, SEFF's Director of Services stated: "This year's Service was particularly poignant in that it was held in The Republic of Ireland for the first time, well over 300 people gathered to be part of a Service which brought together innocents from across the community and from across borders".

"The recurring message from today's event was that when innocent victims unify together across religious and ethnic divides that there is immense power in their collective voice".

"Let us be clear; there was never justification for the use of terrorism and/or criminal violence in the furtherance of or defence of a political objective, the dehumanising of people (often neighbour upon neighbour) was futile and wrong".

"SEFF were privileged to host 20 victims/survivors from Great Britain and Republic of Ireland this weekend, many of whom had never before visited Northern Ireland previously. We hope and pray that those who came to Fermanagh/Donegal this weekend will return to their homes and families with the comfort of knowing that they are part of a larger family - The SEFF family".

"They and their families are not forgotten by those who have walked in their shoes or who have the care to want to understand what life has been and is for them," concluded Mr Donaldson.

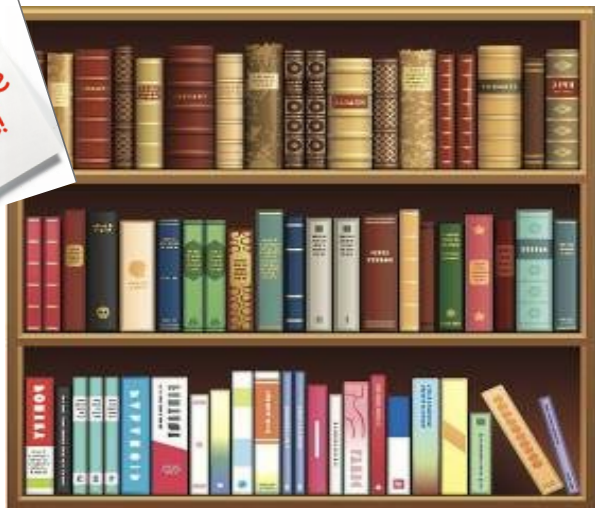
