A term used to organize many different gender identities which have in common some element of crossing over or challenging the gender binary. See the "Transgender Umbrella."


Gender nonconforming/Gender variant
Refers to individuals whose behaviors or interests fall ouside

of what is considered typical for their sex (assigned at birth).

Transphobia Fear or hatred of transgender people.

Drag King/Queen

A performance artist who uses gender as a medium for the purposes of art, entertainment, and sometimes education.



Crossdresser

Anyone who wears clothes of the opposite sex (as assigned at birth) without the gender identity of that sex for pleasure, selfexpression or comfort.

Transsexual

Refers to an individual whose gender identity exists primarily in contradiction to the sex assigned at birth. There are varying facets of transsexual experience which can include: a social transition, a hormonal transition, a surgical transition, or a combination of the above.

Transgenderist Refers to an individual who chooses not to undergo a surgical transition, a.k.a. a non-op transsexual.

Gender Identity

A person's conception of their own gender.

ex: I'm masculine. andro, girly, butch, agender, femme, macho, sissy, etc.

Gender Expression

The performance of one's gender, especially how it is communicated to others through behavior, clothing, haircut, voice, and other forms of presentation.
