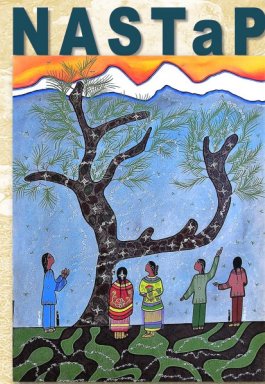
NASTaP, the Association for Native American Sacred Trees and Places,
