Message from Newham NQT Primary Partnership Programme

The UCL Institute of Education (IOE) together with three teaching schools in Newham (East London Early Years and School Partnership, Elmhurst Teaching School Alliance and St. Edwards Catholic Teaching School Alliance) have established a strong partnership to provide high quality, evidence-informed CPD for teachers in Newham and beyond.

Research by Stoll et al, (2012) argues that effective professional development connects work-based learning to external expertise such as that held by HEIs. programmes are structured and informed by research and innovative local practice to enable teachers to apply their professional learning to their classroom practice to improve outcomes for pupils. Teachers engage in a blend of interactive sessions, reading, reflection and action research, as well as having opportunities to observe learning and teaching and take part in learning walks.

As we move towards the end of our second year working in partnership, it is a good time to reflect on the merits that we have found within this collaborative partnership.

The strength of our NQT and NQT+1 provision draws from the advantages that come from this collaboration. The programmes are co-facilitated by an expert from the IOE and an experienced school leader so that participants can benefit from the complementary knowledge, skills and expertise that both partners can offer. The university-based facilitators bring them a wealth understanding of educational

research and policy which combines powerfully with the 'frontline' experience of the school leaders and experienced teachers who facilitate with them. In this way, for example, sessions focused on assessment have been able to support new teachers understand the theories and research that underscores effective formative and summative assessment, and the school based facilitators have been able to elucidate on what this can look like in schools and in the classrooms.

The need for 'external input' into continuing professional development and learning (CPDL) complemented by 'internal specialists' was identified by Coe et al (2015) as a clear finding from their review of evidence on effective professional development for teachers.

The sessions have been based in the excellent training suites at Elmhurst Primary School. Sukwinder Samra, the Director of Elmhurst Teaching School Alliance, has noted the positive impact on professional development both of the participants as well as of the senior leaders facilitating: "Whilst Newham has a long history of successfully inducting new teachers into the profession, the fusion of approaches that is engendered when school leaders and academics work together has been notably impactful. Teachers on the Primary Partnership Programme feel that they are receiving a more thorough grounding in research and theory through the programme, and yet they also report that the content is directly relevant and useful for their day-to-day work in the classroom.



Again, we feel that the success of this approach lies in the effective linking of the complementary fields of academic and professional expertise in education. Senior school leaders facilitating with known experts in a particular field has resulted in improved knowledge and understanding and the payoffs to IOE staff include staying abreast of current school practice."

The NQT and NQT +1 programme is devised as well as delivered in partnership with UCL Institute of Education CoLab and the Teaching Schools and is constantly evolving to respond to participants' needs as well as to address local and national priorities. More successful elements, such as incorporating learning walks, are planned into the programme to strengthen it further.
