With the end of the United Nations Decade on Biodiversity 2011-2020 approaching, policymakers around the world are working towards developing a new post-2020 global biodiversity framework. Innovative approaches are needed to save the world's biodiversity. One type of approach that has gained attention in biodiversity conservation is the so-called "landscape approach", meaning addressing conservation on the scale of the whole landscape, as opposed to individual species, economic sectors, or protected areas. Where humans' production activities are present, healthy "socioecological production landscapes and seascapes" (SEPLS) can support biodiversity while providing for human livelihoods.

This Public Forum aims to inform the general public about these issues and encourage discussion of landscape approaches, production landscapes and seascapes, and biodiversity conservation. The Forum will showcase international and local experiences of SEPLS, and Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems (GIAHS) conservation in Kumamoto.
