## **SUMMARY**

Mr. Mehta is one of the world's leading authorities, researchers and practitioners on sustainable tourism and ecotourism physical planning and both the landscape architectural and architectural aspects of ecolodges. In July 2006, **National Geographic** identified Mr. Mehta as one of five Sustainable Tourism *Pioneers* in the world for his Ecotourism/ Protected Area planning work and for his knowledge dissemination through books, research papers, teaching, international conference key-note presentations and eco-landscape design and planning workshops. Mr. Mehta is also a *Professional Photographer* and Hall Of Fame *Cricket* player from Kenya.

#### WORK EXPERIENCE

- With 22 years of experience in Landscape Architecture and Planning, Mr. Mehta has worked in over 30 countries in six continents.
- From 1997-2007, Mr. Mehta was a Vice-President at EDSA where he started and led the first Ecotourism Planning Market Sector of any company in the world. He was Project manager for the multi-award winning Crosswaters Ecolodge and Spa. He also worked on Sustainable Tourism Plans for National Parks that protect the last remaining endangered species such as Mountain Gorillas in Rwanda; Chimpanzees in Uganda and Rwanda; Giant Pandas in China; Tigers in India and Black Rhinos in Kenya.
- In January 2007, Mr. Mehta re-started his firm **HM Design** which began in Kenya in 1991 and is currently working on projects in Costa Rica, Kenya, China, Namibia, Indonesia, Panama and Dominica.
