Advanced Craft/Supervisory

if you have achieved S/NVQ level 3 or QCF\* equivalent or completed an approved indentured apprenticeship (e.g. with NJCBI, BATJIC etc.) or completed an employer sponsored apprenticeship which included achievement of a City and Guilds Advanced Craft Certificate.

This card is valid for 5 years.



if you have achieved S/NVQ levels 4/5 or QCF\* equivalent in a relevant occupation.
