With the rap of the gavel, John Plueger, the 73rd president of the Wings Club Foundation, opened the Annual Meeting by welcoming guests and noting that it had been an honor to serve during what was a banner year for the organization.

Reviewing objectives for the past year, he highlighted that the Distinguished Scholar Awards were doubled to \$10,000 a student and that the Annual Gala (the organization's main fundraising event) was structured to maximize fundraising potential, thus enabling more aggressive support of opportunities for individuals pursuing an education in the field of aviation. monthly luncheon speakers and the first USA Aviation Day, co-hosted with IATA, further fulfilled the mandate to provide programs to educate students and others about the field of aviation.

A video review of the past year, nominations to the Board of Governors and the induction of four new Golden Eagles preceded the presentation of the Wings Club Foundation and IAWA (International Aviation Women's Association) Outstanding Aviator Award to Wild Weasel Colonel Edward T. Rock (USAF Ret.). A tribute video of Colonel Rock's career and his remarks from the podium gave all in attendance a real feel for his heroics and those of his fellow Wild Weasels at the height of the Vietnam War.

The announcement of Jim McNerney, immediate past Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of The Boeing Company, as this year's Distinguished Achievement Award Recipient elicited wide applause from the attendees. He will be honored at the Annual Gala, held at the Waldorf Astoria on October 21, 2016.

The evening's business ended with the presentation of the President's Gavel to Mary Ellen S. Jones, who will serve as the 74th president of the Wings Club Foundation. Mary Ellen is the second woman to ever hold this post, with Carol B. Hallett who served in 2001/2002, having been the first.

HIGHLIGHTSFROM WINGS CLUB EVENTS SEE WHAT YOU MISSED



Wes Bush Chairman, Chief Executive Officer and President Northrop Grumman Corporation

Noting that it was an exciting time in all the categories and technologies of aerospace, Mr. Bush focused his remarks on one such technology – unmanned aircraft. He further sharpened the focus on autonomous systems that are truly robotic versus those that are controlled by a human pilot and ultimately introduced a category of technology now under development that would "provide the tipping point from which autonomous aircraft will reach their potential ... cognitive autonomous systems." He explained, "these are robotic systems that operate using the same actions that we would expect from the judgment, and ultimately over time, the ethics of a pilot." Mr. Bush concluded with a plea that government not limit R & D, while in China and Russia, "R & D is going full steam ahead."



Doug Parker Chairman and Chief Executive Officer American Airlines Group Inc.

Mr. Parker opened his remarks with a quick look at what American Airlines had achieved in 2015. "At American Airlines last year, we put the airline on a strong financial footing with a profit of \$6.3 billion and a pre-tax margin of 15.3%... something few thought we could do this early in the merger." He then transitioned to his remarks concerning what it means to be running an airline today. "Business today is in a transformational state... and the biggest transformational piece is getting everyone to understand that this industry has changed... structurally, fundamentally and permanently changed." He continued that, as management, you have to believe that it has changed and then make the leap. "It's a whole different world today. Once you realize this you know you have to manage differently."



James Hogan President and Chief Executive Officer Etihad Airways

"The secret weapon of Etihad Airways is to grow the airline through partnership." With that as his opening statement, James Hogan discussed Etihad's model for airline competition. "Global air travel is a business with incredibly high barriers to entry...the highest barrier is network. You can't build a global network overnight. That's where partnership comes in. We've take an open partnership approach, working with scores of airlines on codeshare agreements. Then we took that one step further with minority equity investments in strategically important airlines. Together, we've been able to create a new competitive choice for air travelers. That's good for consumers, good for tourism and good for trade." Mr. Hogan said he believed that many of the issues raised about Etihad Airways by the Open Skies Campaign stemmed from a lack of understanding of the airline's partnership business model.

Dublin. Ireland March 10, 2016

Greeting the guests at the 10th Annual Dublin Luncheon, Marlin Dailey, European Committee Chairman, extended his appreciation to the Dublin Aviation Community for their continued support of the Wings Club Foundation and extended a special welcome to the Irish Aviation Students Association (IAŜA). He then turned the Ceremonial Gavel over to James Meyler, the incoming Chairman of the European Committee, who presided over the meeting and introduced the speaker, Mr. Tewolde GebreMarian, Group Chief Executive Officer, Ethiopian Airlines.

Mr. GebreMarian used the opportunity as the first head of an African airline to address the Dublin gathering to provide a captivating and informative review of the history of Ethiopian Airlines' development - which in many cases paralleled the very history of Africa's development - and to share his vision for the airline's future.

From being the first airline to bring jet service to Africa, Ethiopian has grown to serve 93 international destinations on five continents and 20 destinations within Africa. A member of the Star Alliance since 2011, today the airline carries 6.4 million passengers a year and is the largest cargo carrier in Africa.

About the future, Mr. GebreMarian made the case that Africa is a young continent, full of natural and human resources; very challenging, but "a continent you need to put into your strategy." About Ethiopian, he lets their slogan say it all... Ethiopian, the New Spirit of Africa.
