REVIEW OF GIRLGUIDING UK FORMS

As from January 2011 <u>ALL</u> Girlguiding UK forms have been reviewed and updated. Although the old forms will still be available on the website for the next 6 months they are replaced with the following 5 forms:

Residential Notification Form to tell your Commissioner your plans and to seek her approval.

Consent Form to gain parental permission for an event/ activity/residential.

Health Form for health information for residential events.

International Health Form for International travel only.

International Notification form for use by International Advisers.

QUILTING

The most pleasing things were that so many of you wanted to support Hadlow, that the cry for 'more stockings to be stitched' was heard and resulted in all the stockings we needed being made, that Santa (s) were available! That the SS booked on and came and worked like troopers, that Trefoil Guild and Friends of Hadlow and the Girlguiding Wirral Essentials Team worked their socks off, and that helpers, leaders and girls joined in the spirit of the event and made it truly magical. In addition to the very special sense of belonging that there was surrounding the whole event, you managed to raise £3,700...... astounding! Thank you!
