News from the Ardagh Community Trust



Common is Outstanding again for 2018! We are thrilled to announce that the work done by volunteers on Horfield Common has again been iudaed to be outstanding by the RHS' It's Your Neighbourhood team of judges.

Horfield

Volunteers welcomed the judges to the common in July and spent an enjoyable couple of hours showing them around, explaining how volunteers work to support enhancements to the common in addition to the maintenance carried out by BCC and some of the volunteer-led projects that have been ongoing this year. It is a brilliant achievement and a really lovely recognition for all of the volunteers working so hard to ensure that Horfield Common and the Ardagh are welcoming, accessible and enjoyable for all. Well done!

Park Flooring Funding! We were delighted to hear that funding has finally been agreed to sort out the flooring of the children's play area at the top end of the common, near Dorian Road. This has not been fit for purpose since the play area was originally installed and has meant that the play area has not been able to be used year-round. Local families and parents have been asking for this to be sorted out since the play area was originally installed, so this is brilliant news.

Junior Parkrun on Horfield Common!

Our fundraiser to bring Junior Parkrun to Horfield Common is progressing with more than £500 now raised of the £3000 total (thank you Bishopston Matters for donating the first £50!). In order to start to run the event, Junior Parkrun require that volunteer teams buy a full kit, which includes barcode scanners, stopwatches, signs, bollards, a defibrillator and other items, so this is what the funding will be used for. Proposal for a competitor catering concession on Horfield Common

Thank you very much to everyone who responded to the council's most recent consultation regarding the proposal to install a competitive catering concession or the common next to the children's play area near the Ardagh. FoHC objected to this proposal because of the negative





impact this would have on the Café on the Common, and proposed that a better site for an additional facility would be near to the children's play area at the top end of the common. We are awaiting the outcome of consideration of this by BCC licensing and will report back in next month's BM.

Horfield Seedlings - The wonderful children and families gardening group 'Horfield Seedlings' has now ended for 2018. Mo. Manas and Anne, the brilliant volunteers who have led this work - working in partnership with the RHS' Community Outreach team – will be reviewing how the sessions have gone and working on plans for spring 2019. We'll let you know as soon as we have details and look forward to seeing the seedlings back in the spring. Thank you very much to all involved for their hard work to make this project such a success!



This long-established trail offers an unhurried opportunity to buy original artwork - from paintings and prints to stone sculptures and jewellery - with myriad objects in-between. North Bristol Artists look forward to this weekend as an opportunity to show off the artwork they have been creating throughout the year. It's a perfect time of year to inspire people to buy original artwork and handmade designs for loved ones. Trail-goers can enjoy visiting artists in their own homes and studios, while bumping into friends and soaking up the atmosphere of streets bustling with art lovers. Some of our artists are

recognised at regional and national levels for their art, craft or design work, many show in exhibitions and galleries. The trail offers a network of like-minded people and allows them to show work directly to the public.

The skills of North Bristol Artists are wide and varied - from curating exhibitions, running galleries and publishing books - to community support and public art. The North Bristol Art Trail is a time for every member to connect with the local community and share the wonderful wealth of art in the area. Last year the Gloucester Road Art Banners were erected in time for the trail and many of them show artwork by North Bristol Artists. Other artists offer homemade cakes and refreshments so look for the glass sign

beside venues on the map. Once you fall in love with a piece of art you can pay with







cash and some artists can take card payments. Even if you can't afford an original piece you can buy a print or card of the artwork and many artists are represented in shops and galleries on Gloucester Road all year round. The



North Bristol Artists website offers details of all the artists. You can download the map or pick one up at various public venues like libraries and doctors' surgeries, coffee shops, and local shops along Gloucester Road, Whiteladies Road, Redland Road and Zetland Road, and at any of the 50 art trail venues. Saturday 9 to Monday 11 February 2019

Four years ago Lucy Reeves Khan illuminated Bishopston with the very first Window Wanderland. It was such a success that she has gone on to help thousands of people create their own magical outdoor art trail from tower blocks to villages, in the UK and abroad, and it all started with you.

Now, as the country heads towards Brexit, Lucy has organised a special Wanderland in Bishopston for 2019 which she hopes will help us celebrate 'Britishness' and what it means to be British.

"Personally I am grateful for Britain, as I don't know of many other countries where I could have met and married a man from Pakistan and lived hasslefree. Because of that tolerance I really love it but I don't say it enough, as I can feel apologetic about its political decisions," says Lucy.

"The windows don't have to be political...this is not about Jingoism. From All You Need Is Love to a full English breakfast there is so much out there that is British.

"You can bypass politics and just go for something that you like which is British even if it's unexpected. Chicken Tikka Masala for example – that was created in Britain. Cats in windows - there are not many countries who love their cats like we do."

However, the Britishness theme is not compulsory for 2019.

"It's just a suggestion and categorically no one has to join the theme if they don't want to; but, in the few years that we've been doing Wanderlands people have done many windows that could so easily be part of this - David

> Bowie. Suffragettes, and even the Queen pops up! It's free expression and, as long as it is child-friendly, anything goes! Did you know we invented the toothbrush?"



Thanks to everyone who came along to our inaugural AGM at Horfield Parish Church Hall on Saturday 29 September; it was a wonderful celebration of all that has been achieved by local people over the last couple of years and lovely to update everyone about the wide range of work that ACT has been doing alongside our main priority this year; that is, negotiating with Bristol City Council over a community asset transfer lease for the Ardagh, which would provide it with a sustainable future under community management.

The Café on the Common - The Café on the Common continues to go from strength to strength, which is one of the reasons that we were disappointed with BCC's proposal to create a pitch for another catering vendor to trade on the common next to the children's play area near the Ardagh. Along with FoHC, we believe that there is a better location for this at the top end of the common, which would provide increased facilities for local people and park users, rather than duplicate them. By the time you are reading this, BCC's licensing team should have decided about whether the current proposal - which we do not support - will be allowed to go ahead. We will update readers in the next BM and thank everyone who has been in touch and taken part in the consultation for their support. The café is a wonderful facility, but it relies on large

numbers of volunteers to ensure that it remains viable and sustainable direct competition of this sort would be really undermining - so we are keeping our fingers crossed



Sailing Success for Sally!

On the phone, local Horfield resident and sailing champion Sally Rodrigues asks that when I arrive at Horfield Leisure Centre. "Please walk to me and greet me and introduce yourself, I'll have my dog Lillie". This is

because this champion I am meeting is blind.

It's not Sally's blindness though that defines her (she was born sighted and, due to a degenerative condition diagnosed at the age of 6, it wasn't until her late teens, she lost her full sight), it's the collection of gold, silver and bronze medals she has won in sailing across the globe, including World and Nationals – and there is her zeal for life – she exudes positivity.

Always an adrenaline junkie, and with a law degree and her own complementary therapy business -Rodrigues Relaxation, based at the Cameron Centre in Lockleaze - sailing came guite late to Sally.

Born in Hertfordshire, she moved to Bristol and soon adopted our neighbourhood as home. It was around 10 years ago being guite new in the area that she read an advert in the RNIB pamphlet – The East Anglian Sailing Trust were on the search for sailors to join them. Sally has always felt an affinity with water (she also swam for the National Squad in her teens) - and so began her affair with the sea. Her first boat she stepped foot on was a solid 29-foot wooden craft. She admits she wasn't very good to start with - but her enthusiasm and team spirit were there, and with tips like feeling the sun and wind on certain parts of her face helping her to find her direction, her skills soon honed in.





in her hair, the speed sensation and freedom, even sailing in snow conditions sent her head over heels in love for the sport. "I fondly remember I had a huge smile on my face the whole time I was at sea in the snow. The irony being that I could still have a huge smile on my

face even though I couldn't feel it!"


Sally and Lillie regularly stroll to Horfield Leisure Centre – which is one of her sponsors and handily on the doorstep, for fitness training and swimming, during which time Lillie takes a break and is pampered in her basket with the Horfield team. Sally and the GB squad are also resident at the UK Sailing Academy in Cowes on the Isle of Wight, they train there as well as regular sessions on Lake Windermere, all keeping her and the team shipshape.

By March 2017 to her utter uncontained joy (you may have heard her scream from the top of Purdown!), she was selected to represent Great Britain at the World Fleet Blind Sailing Championships, in America - Lake Michigan. She described the opening ceremony for her and the GB crew, made up of 50/50 sighted and blind sailors, as hugely emotional, "the stuff dreams are made of". Their skill was well rewarded with 1 gold medal, 2 silvers and the Squadron Cup. Sally recently returned from the 2018 Blind Match Racing World Championships with a silver for GB!

So, what's next? Well definitely more sailing – she was off to Cowes for the weekend - but important to Sally is to now campaign for Blind Sailing to be recognised as a sport by the next Paralympics in 2020. It was a pleasure to meet with inspirational Sally at Horfield Leisure Centre and take a look at her most recent silver medal. 


those sometimes gloomy week-ends in late November. Only the participating artists and their friends and family know just how much work goes on throughout the year to make this magical and now legendary

Community sessions with SENDaWelcome



SendAWelcome aims to make BS7 a more inclusive community for children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). To

do this we've been working with a number of local partners to help develop their inclusive practice so that children with SEND and their families can enjoy the same local opportunities and activities as their peers. After forging successful partnerships with King's Lawn Tennis Club, Circomedia and Golden Hill Community Garden, we teamed up with the Children's Scrapstore this summer to make art and creativity accessible to a broader audience.

From its modest base in St Werburgh's, the Children's Scrapstore has managed to turn reusing waste materials into a creative enterprise. The charity collects around 140 tonnes of clean waste, such as cardboard tubes, rope and fabric, from local businesses each year. The waste, which would otherwise go to landfill, is then used for creative play and education by over 1000 groups in and around Bristol. As well as visiting schools to promote play and creativity, Scrapstore also runs events in their own inhouse PlayRoom. This summer the charity decided to welcome more local children into the PlayRoom by making its classes more inclusive.

"We felt that the space had the potential to host a more diverse community of visitors," says Louise, Taylor, events and marketing officer at the Children's Scrapstore, "With the help of SendaWelcome, City Council bridging workers, and other local providers including Golden Hill Community Garden, we developed our practice, in readiness to run our first programme of sessions for children with SEND."

From working with these local groups and services, Scrapstore decided to limit the number of children in the room and increase the level of adult support. This proved to be a winning formula. "My son loved this session," says one local mum. "The organisers kindly put the tuff trays up on tables, as he is unable to manoeuvre on the floor, so he found it easier to stand and play. The session was quieter so that it was more suitable for kids with additional needs. It means that disabled children get the same opportunities for fun as everyone else."



The Scrapstore staff saw the benefits too. "One of our favourite moments from this summer was seeing new visitors coming back for a second and third session," says Louise. "It was also seeing a child staying for an hour, when their adult


thought they might want to leave after five minutes."

The Scrapstore is continuing to run its Friday afternoon session as well as adding an inclusive session in the half term holiday this autumn. On 2 November, children with SEND and their families are invited to a session called Constellations, a multi-media exploration of the night sky. 

Bishopston, Cotham & Redland Community Partnership



BCR CP Forum meeting, 8 October 2018

The recent Bishopston, Cotham and Redland forum meeting gave the community an opportunity to catch up with the work of many of the local groups and organisations, including the police and councillors. Fourteen local groups were represented at the meeting and told of the events and projects they were currently involved in; the local councillors also gave updates on libraries, the Bristol Transport Strategy consultation and on the recent funding round under the new Community Infrastructure Levy allocation process; locally, the committee voted to fund the provision of allweather surfacing at Horfield Common playground and to pay for the replacement of street trees in our area. It was agreed that the process for identifying and prioritising projects for funding this year

had been poor and the community made suggestions that the councillors will feed into the review of the CIL process for next year. It was agreed that the CP would help with identification, consultation and prioritisation of projects brought forward by the local community through the forum and focused meetings.

The Neighbourhood Police Team Sergeant, Jonathan Scott, confirmed that a new Beat Manager Dave Jackson would start shortly, replacing Tom Green, in Bishopston, and that this post was still vacant in Redland and Cotham. The residents voiced their concern that there was little continuity and a fast turnover of police personnel in the area; Jon Scott confirmed that the PCSOs were still David Said and Danielle Packer. Policing priorities are set out on the Avon & Somerset website for each local area, where you can also add your suggestions.

We heard from Street Scene Group that a coordinator for activities to replace Liz Kew was urgently needed. There are a number of local people who are SSG volunteers, but the group needs someone to take over with helping them work together on litter picks, etc. The group was helping the Gloucester Road BID tidy up the area in time for the Great British High Street judging and continues to hold drop-in sessions on the second Monday of the month at Bishopston Library 4.30-6.00pm to give advice and help on reporting issues.

High Kingsdown reported that their newly refurbished playground was to be opened by Lord Mayor Cleo Lake on Saturday 13 October, funded through Clifton and BCR Neighbourhood Partnerships.

Trader organisations and Friends of Parks and Libraries groups in our area gave reports on the many activities planned for the area. A full list is included in the BCR CP meeting notes which are on

It's all in the planning – improving Bishopston's surroundings



Planning our neighbourhood - improving Bishopston; this was the theme of The Bishopston Society's (TBS) public meeting on **Tuesday 2 October** 2018 - that I was pleased to attend.

After a concise summary of the AGM finances and activities, the Chair was able to introduce the first speaker, Peter Insole

of City Design Group, who iterated the importance of our historical environment in a modern society. Did you know that Gloucester Road was the bottom of an ancient river valley - which explains why today it remains to be such a winding stretch. Buildings define an area, and Gloucester Road in particular is recognised for its gabled roof forms. This was a consideration when the recent extension of the Gloucester Road Conservation Area, which TBS was involved with – both arguing for and identifying, resulted in a long stretch of the road from the Arches to the Sommerville Road junction and part of North Road now being included within this designation. The full background document which describes the Gloucester Road Conservation Area can be found by visiting www.bristol.gov.uk and typing Gloucester Road into the search box – it is the first document that comes up on the list.

The next presenter was local Neil Embleton, a conservation architect and planning advisor with The Bishopston Society, who responds to local planning applications. He outlined and illustrated some of the issues and problems arising from poorly designed planning applications that are submitted with little thought for their jarring effect on the original appearance of our Victorian and Edwardian streets. He urged us to reflect on the styles of extensions and the growth of paving front gardens in a way that not only considers the architectural surroundings but the natural landscape. If you are curious about planning applications in the area then why not visit the new Bishopston Planning Portal where you can comment, read about policies, and find out what is considered good and bad architecture – www.bishopstonsocietv. org.uk/planning.

Finally, we heard from Alison Bromilow, of the Bristol Neighbourhood Planning Network who had the challenge of explaining the complexities of the planning system, including the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF), the Regional Joint Spatial Plan (JSP) and the Local Plan. Her sentiment is, we can affect what happens in our area by becoming involved in the Local Plan and to do so she gave some top tips on making comments on planning applications.

- Pick out the important points
- Stick strictly to planning issues
- Ask planning officers 'why do they feel a particular/specific feature isn't worth protecting'?

The meeting concluded with ideas from the audience on how we might continue to improve **Bishopston. Suggestions included:**

- RPZ Review of existing potential areas that could benefit
- Free public transport
- Increase Park & Ride provision especially in light of a possible arena and the elimination of the Severn Bridge toll
- Consider locations of street furniture such as bins and benches. Do we need more or fewer?
- Maintenance of overgrown hedges and trees
- Local and affordable provision of accommodation for those considering downsizing
- More awareness of future developments
- Keeping local streets clean of tagging and fly tipping

Local History Matters

Seyer's Parsonage

BHA local history research – text copyright Denis Wright.

In 1804, the Reverend Samuel Sever published a pamphlet on the Causes of Clerical Non-Residence. His main argument was that the major 'cause' of non-residence amongst the clergy was nothing more nor

less than a lack of parsonages. In 1810, Seyer was appointed to the curacy of Horfield and then, in 1813, to the perpetual curacy of Horfield (ie, curacy for life) with no mention of a parsonage in either case. The whole process, from pamphlet to slate roof, lasted for close on twenty years and involved the 'written consent' of people of a wide social status.

A typical example is the following (draft) letter written by Seyer in April 1823 to the Reverend Henry Hare, a copyholder of Horfield manor, who lived at Curtisknowle, near Totness, Devon, reminding him of what he had already signed up to a decade earlier.

I take the liberty of requesting your attention to the following statement. The Parish of Horfield in which I understand that yourself & Mrs Hare have an interest is without any Parsonage house to the great detriment of the inhabitants & I have been for several years endeavouring to procure a plot of ground fit for the purpose. I have at length prevailed on the Bishop & his lessee Mr Shadwell to mark out an acre of ground on the Common close to the churchyard I have taken great pains to procure the consent of the Commoners to this measure. Some years ago I wrote to Mr. Wm. Hare (your father Sir, as I believe) on this subject; and I have his answer now in my hand dated 14 April 1814 in which he gives his full consent; I shall have very great pleasure (he says) as far as my interest extends in acceding to your wishes with regard to two acres ('one' intended) from Horfield Common





being inclosed for the purpose of erecting a Parsonage house'. Allow me to add, that I have the written consent of all the Principal lessees and of the others, farmers in Horfield. I know that they tell me that they are desirous of having a resident minister & they will signify their Consent whenever I ask them. Under the Circumstances, my request is that you will signify your Consent (yourself & Mrs Hare) to the measure proposed, in any form of words which you may think proper with the signature also of a witness & send it to me in a letter by the Post; and for myself & my successors in this poor curacy I shall hold myself obliged.


One copyholder, Sophia Henderson of Camden Town, was an enthusiastic supporter of Seyer's work, wishing him 'success in his undertaking which she is convinced will be of great benefit to the Parish of Horfield'. Jane Smith, of Heath House, on the other hand, could only bring herself to write to a social inferior in the third person or perhaps through an intermediary:

Mrs Smythe's Comp'ts to Mr Seyer & informs him she can have no Objections to what the Landowners & the Lord of the Manor have consented to respecting the Glebe & Parsonage House.

French Bulldog knocks Labrador off the top spot!

For the first time, French Bulldogs have overtaken Labradors as the UKs most registered breed. In the last 10 years, the French Bulldog has increased in numbers

by 2964%. And this figure only includes those dogs that are registered with Kennel Club! Their numbers increased by 44% in 2016 alone. At the Animal Health Centre, I have seen this rise in popularity and we are definitely seeing more of these types of dogs through our door.

What is a French Bulldog? The French Bulldog is a brachycephalic, utility breed. It is derived partly from the UK, when Toy Bulldogs were taken over from England to Northern France due to emigration. It is thought that some crosses were made to other short faced breeds and, after three decades, a new breed known as the French Bulldog had evolved. In 1906 the Kennel Club gave official recognition to the breed.

What is a brachycephalic dog? These are dogs that are bred to have shorter muzzles or flat faces. Their genetics make their skulls grow wider and shorter. This characteristic can be greatly exaggerated: with the most pronounced being Pugs and French Bulldogs.

Why are they so popular? People find their big eyes and wide faces very cute and endearing. They are small, companion dogs with short coats and suited to small walks. However, there is more to these fashionable Frenchies than just a squashed face....

Are there health problems to be aware about? Unfortunately, these breeds do have more than their fair share of health problems. And these problems begin even before the puppy has entered the world! That is because these dogs struggle to give birth naturally. This is due to the wider face shape in proportion to the mum's birth canal.

Another problem is Brachycephalic Obstructive Airway Syndrome (BOAS). Some dogs with flat faces struggle to breathe properly and make snorting noises because of their restricted airway. This leads to a difficulty to cool down and they are unable to exercise normally. In some dogs it can be so bad that they retch and regurgitate stomach contents.

Skin problems are also common. Allergies and folded skin make these dogs prone to itching and infections; especially skin fold dermatitis around the muzzle, vulva and tail.

Bulging eyes due to shallow eye sockets also mean

that these dogs cannot blink properly and so are at risk of eye ulceration.

These breeds can also be prone to spinal problems if they have oddly shaped vertebrae in the spinal column.

All these health problems often mean that an owner of a brachycephalic breed has to spend more time and money at the vets. Insurance companies are aware of the above health conditions and so their fees will be much higher. Due to their sudden popularity, it is a worry that puppy farms will start to produce more unhealthy dogs to meet demand. As a vet, I like to see well-bred, disease free dogs and it is sad to see dogs struggling with genetic problems. Therefore, before buying a dog, please do your research and choose a breed right for your lifestyle. Visit the Kennel Club website to research breeds, talk to dog owners and always buy from reputable breeders; such as one that is part of the Kennel Club's Assured Breeders Scheme.

Redesigning Your Garden

Jobs to do now - As the days get shorter and the nights draw in, it's time to think about putting the garden to bed for the winter. Clean garden tools and the barbeque and store them away in a shed if you have one; treat outdoor furniture with protective oils, store only perfect, unblemished veg from your vegetable patch anything damaged won't keep. 

They have come along way in the past two years and they have great plans for the future – both with installing fantastic play resources outside and extending the building itself, all for the benefit of local families.



Is this your first book and what is it about?

This is my first novel. After delaying my creative writing since undergrad days, I decided to return to fiction and commit to a novel. Reflecting a tradition of US fiction that centres on dysfunctional families. it is a story of a family struggling to survive on its own terms. It is also a part coming-of-age, part retrospective narrative. Every family has its secrets and some have sibling rivalries. When Jo O'Brien returns home after her mother's death she is forced to confront both. An unexpected inheritance fans the flames of existing tensions between Jo and her brother, and it's their mother's long-forgotten diary that recalls the messy aftermath of an uncle's sexual advances towards Jo when she was a teenager. Like the diary, Jo's memory of events is full of gaps. but one thing is certain - she will never regain what was lost. How We Remember traces the effects of alcoholism, mental illness and abuse on one Irish-Italian-American, working-class family. RedDoor Publishing believes the novel will attract fans of Anne Tyler and Sylvia Brownrigg. Book clubs will love it for its probing possibilities.

How did you come up with the idea?

Early ideas were inspired after my own mother died and I was grieving, trying to make sense of complex family dynamics, their histories and secrets. This led me to ask what might happen to a family after the 'manager of family relationships' dies. I pondered about the nature of inheritances, not so much the financial sense (although this features in the book). but how children inherit their parents' histories and may adopt certain characteristics within the family. What emerged was a narrative about a middle-age

this condition? I was diagnosed with relapsing remitting MS in 2005 when my children were ages six and nine and I was right in the middle of a full-time PhD. It was an awful time that stopped me in my tracks and took a long time from which to recover. The main character of the novel is in her fifties and has secondary progressive MS. She's a childless academic who was successful but is later worn down by illness and increasing career demands. This aspect of her character, along with some other content that drives the narrative, is an example of a writer's experiment with the 'what if' scenario. I examined my own experience of MS (which has not progressed to secondary). I then imagined what a stressful academic working life in London would feel like for a woman like Jo who has secondary progressive MS

and has to travel daily on the underground to work

with fatigue, constant pain in her leg and a walking

stick at her side keeping her upright.

Remembrance at the Memorial Buildings

Horfield Baptist Church will be commemorating this month's centenary of the ending of World War One at its own Memorial Buildings.

The church's Memorial Buildings are next to the main church building facing Gloucester Road and incorporate the church's Fresh Ground Café. They were built in memory of those who served and the 39 men from the church who were killed in the First World War. The names of the fallen are recorded on a stone at the front of the buildings, which were opened in 1922.

The church is putting up a remembrance silhouette inside its Fresh Ground Café and adding 39 poppies to represent the church members who died. Further information and stories about some of those church members will also be added. From 5 November everyone in the Bishopston area is invited to visit during café opening hours (Monday to Friday 10am to 2pm) and purchase a British Legion poppy. This poppy can then be added to the silhouette in memory of someone lost in war from their own family, along with a name and other details if they wish.

On Sunday 11 November Horfield Baptist's Remembrance Service will start at 10.30am outside the Memorial Buildings and continue inside the church after the two-minute silence at 11am. You would be very welcome to attend the service or observe the silence for this centenary remembrance.

Redland ward news

Sale of the Bristol North Baths building

The sale of the redevelopment of the old Bristol North Baths building is now at a new stage. Despite our concerns about the loss of community uses we understand that one bidder has been successful with initial plans for offices, a café and small fitness suite. Any profits from sale will be ring-fenced for affordable housing across the city. Like many residents we were concerned that the bid was selected purely on maximum income, and will spell the end of any option of community uses in the listed building. We did challenge which criteria would be used to assess the offers with a view to retaining some kind of community involvement but the administration remains firmly of the view that the library fulfils the community element of the overall project. This is a great disappointment to us as well as many people, we are sure.

Parking – We are still being sent photos almost daily of dangerous parking and obstructed roads and several local residents have now attended the Full Council themselves to address the Mayor on parking problems and to ask for council support to develop solutions. There have also been further incidents of emergency vehicles being trapped on the way to call outs, and collisions in congested streets. While the administration has promised officer support to look at potential solutions, this has yet to materialise, so Fi and Martin are pressing for some action on this. In the meantime, we are conducting some door-to door-surveys in some of the affected areas. If you think your road is being affected by poor parking then please let us know and we will come and talk to residents in your street.

In other parking news, the extensions to Redland (RD) and Cotham North (CN) RPZs have now been in place for over a year, so a review of these areas is underway to ensure they are operating as intended.

The review will aim to resolve issues relating to the:

- location of parking bays, double yellow lines and disabled bays
- balance of parking, i.e. whether certain parking bays would better serve the area if changed to shared use, permit holders only or Pay & Display parking.

The scope of the review does not include changes to the boundary or operating hours/days of the schemes, as these were fully considered, and consulted upon, as part of the RD and CN review that included the implementation of the extension

Bristol waste — Recently entire streets have had their recycling collections missed, with some waiting for several days before it's been picked up. Clearly this is more than a glitch, so please let us know if this happens to you so that we get a clearer picture of the situation. Please do report missed collections via the council website so the extent of the problem can be logged and to remind the council to provide the service.

Meanwhile, Martin and Fi are disappointed that the council refuse methodology review (considering new ways of collecting recyclables and waste and the vehicles needed) only recommended an additional blue box for mixed recyclables. Not only will this clutter pavements but we can't see it increasing recycling as residents can already request an additional recycling box or food waste bin if they need one. Adding a new colour box for mixed recyclables also confuses the established sorting guidelines that help crews collect materials efficiently by the kerbside. On the plus side, our kerbside sorting scheme for recyclables means there is a firm market for Bristol's recycling materials, thanks to their quality and sorted categories - unlike some areas that have mixed packaging and recycling collections that may end up being exported and never recycled.

Fly tipping and lack of enforcement -

Several people have contacted us about the lack of enforcement from the council over fly tipping, even where residents have clearly identified the offender. We're pushing for increased resource on this, as once again, we feel that residents are doing everything they can but aren't getting the right support from the council, which is disheartening. We have, however, been told that the new 'litter police' have been active on Gloucester Road so we are trying to get some feedback on how they have been doing in our area.

Arena – We had a lot of emails about the arena, almost entirely in support of the established city arena project site. We share the view that the city centre site, prepared and ready to build, remains the best one for the city, environmentally, socially and economically, as a viable project that would create a council asset long-awaited by many residents. Now this has been cancelled by the Mayor we're both really disappointed – and believe that this means that there won't be a project for many years. If it does go ahead at the Filton Brabazon Hangar we have grave concerns about its traffic impact on Gloucester Rd on top of all the other developments in the north of the city.

Tackling disposable plastics – At the time of writing, Martin's petition to call on the council to eliminate single-use disposable plastics from its

activities had just reached 3,500 signatures so looks set to be debated at Full Council – you can still add weight by signing it via 38 degrees or the council petitions page. Fi had started work as cabinet member to get rid of such plastics in council-owned premises such as parks and museums, but this seems to have stalled, so here's hoping that the petition will kick-start action by the council to play its part in reducing waste.

Bishopston ward news

Spending our community's money

When developers build in our local areas, they have to pay the council some money towards 'community infrastructure'. Most of this is managed by the council and goes into big projects, but some is reserved for spending in the vicinity of the development. The council has created a new way of making decisions on this funding, using committees of councillors meeting annually to take decisions. Our committee met recently, and three decisions for spending the money were made that are of relevance to our ward.

The first of these was to spend £40k on resurfacing the northern play area on Horfield Common (by the Leisure Centre). This has suffered from drainage and surface issues since it was installed, and so resurfacing will improve the playing environment for the children and help avoid accidents.

Secondly, we agreed £21k for road safety improvements around Ashley Down, with a special concentration on Ashley Down Road and routes to Brunel Field school. This is in addition to the £16k being spent on the double yellow lines work that we've mentioned in previous issues. We've agreed with officers that this should be a package of safety measures on Ashley Down Road including bollards, flashing school signs, an additional interactive 20mph sign, and an extra no through road sign for Arthur Milton St. Any remaining money will be used to the cricket ground on Nevil Road, which children use to get to school.

We also know that it would be good to upgrade the road signs pointing to the cricket ground, in order

to improve safety, avoid visitors going to the wrong entrance, lorries getting stuck on narrow streets, etc. This is being taken forward separately by the council, working with the cricket club and Destination Bristol.



Finally, we will be using over £5k of money to plant new street trees across the ward, helping to green the local environment and replace trees that have been lost to disease or age.

The new process to decide on spending the money was quite rushed, and next year we're hoping to have more community involvement in suggesting improvements and making the decisions. Bishopston Matters will be one of the ways we'll do that, so watch this space!

Free flu jab for carers - Local charity Carers Support Centre are keen to remind unpaid carers that they are entitled to a free flu jab. It is an unpredictable virus that can cause mild or unpleasant

illness in most people. However, it can cause severe illness and even death among vulnerable groups. If you are looking after someone with an illness or disability, you may be concerned about how being ill will affect you and the person you care for. If you are the main carer for an elderly or disabled person who may be put at risk if you fall ill, you should be offered a free flu jab. Other categories of people also eligible for a free flu jab include those aged over 65, those who are pregnant, and those with certain health conditions. To arrange for a free jab, just ask your GP practice or pharmacy.
