

The Vicarage Day in Politics

As the General Election draws ever nearer, Vicarage Primary School hold A Day in Politics .

On Wednesday, 3 May 2017, the entire school took part in the Challenge Day, working in teams to set up and run their own political parties.

Throughout the day the pupils worked in teams to come up with creative new ways to help the country and make it an even better place to live.

The pupils practised debating, writing manifestos and creating all the promotional materials for their political party.

At the end of the day, each class held a hustings and the school voted.

A Year 1 teacher said: "Today really ties in with the theme of democracy we've been discussing. They are learning that everyone has a say but you don't always get your own way."



A Year 4 pupil said: "We've learnt what politicians do today and why their jobs are so important. They work in teams to come up with ideas for helping us to live better."

The political life continues for Vicarage pupils. A group of thirty Year 3 and 4 pupils had the opportunity to take a business visit to IBM and learnt how to build an app.

Meanwhile, pupils in Year 5 were visiting the Department for Work and Pensions.

Vicarage is in the first year of working with Enabling Enterprise to develop pupil enterprise skills, including: aiming high, working in a team and overcoming challenges. The programme complements the work the school does on British Values, teaching pupils the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect.

Hartley Primary School pupil, Joshua John, has just returned from representing England at the World Under 11 Chess Championships in Romania.

The tournament was played in Romania's Palace of Culture. Joshua came 38 out of 76 in his category.

Richard Harding, the Newham co-ordinator for Chess in Schools & Communities said "This was a great experience for Joshua and he can be very pleased with his 50% score."

The Year 5 pupil was one of only two English contenders among 76 players



from all over the world.

Joshua started attending the Hartley Centre Chess Club in East Ham in 2013 and he won this year's Newham Junior Grand Prix. Joshua has an international chess federation rating of 1392.

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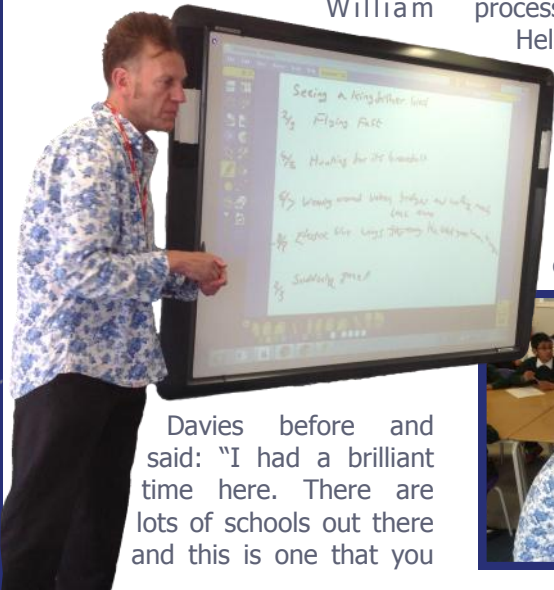

From William Davies welcomes poet Paul...

On Thursday, 11 May 2017 poet Paul Lyalls was in residence at William Davies Primary School.

Paul spent the afternoon with pupils in Year 6, sharing ideas and methods for creating poetry.

Paul has worked with pupils at William



Davies before and said: "I had a brilliant time here. There are lots of schools out there and this is one that you

want to come back to."

His core lesson for writing poetry was simple: "Draw on world events, little moments life throws at you, that you come across, a paper bag being blown in the wind." And always carry a notebook and pen.

Paul guided the pupils through the process of writing their own poetry.

Helping them to generate ideas by identifying moments from their own lives that could be the starting point of a poem, Paul then introduced them to a five-line structure and its value in communicating an image or



idea. Ideas ranged from one pupil's baby cousin saying their name for the first time to a family cat becoming stuck on the fence again.

Paul explained the value of poetry in education: "It's that perfect nutshell of fun with words and possibility."

The possibilities certainly seem endless for Paul this year as he is preparing to release a poetry collection for adults in the Autumn, which explores how we use words as a performance in everyday life. He will also be taking up the role of Poet in Residence for Islington's Word2017 Festival and working with Arsenal Football Club.

...To Curwen's poets compete

Pupils in Year 5 and 6 at Curwen Primary School have had their poetry exhibited in Stratford Library.

The work is the result of a lunchtime poetry workshop and competition.

The theme for the competition was "School is cool because..." The winners performed their poems to friends and family at Stratford Library, which is displaying the pieces throughout May.

The group worked with enthusiasm



and imagination to produce poems of real quality. One young poet said: "It allows your imagination to be free."

The result were poems on topics ranging from Oreos, coconuts and Star Wars to nature and school holidays.

Daniel Headley, who organised the competition, said: "Being passionate about poetry and actively attending a group (Newham Poetry Group), I was excited to give children interested in poetry the same opportunity to write and to perform. Children see the world differently and their imagination is their signature. Poetry is a platform for them to showcase their signature."

Pupils who made an outstanding effort in the competition were rewarded with free cinema tickets from Stratford Picturehouse.
