Creating art to challenge and educate both young people and communities about valuing diversity and individual identity and the dangers of prejudice: Artists and young people who have worked on the project will be present

National News

Anonymous crime reporting service *Crime-stoppers* **is busier than ever.** Almost half of those who contact it are under 35, and one in five is from black or minority ethnic groups. Why is that? Some 60% of the reports Crime stoppers sends to police forces - 92,000 cases - are drugs-related

People's Vote march: Sadiq Khan says young people's voice 'should be heard'. The Mayor of London Sadiq Khan on why it's important young people's voices were heard at the People's Vote march on Saturday: "Young People (will be) leading the march - and that's right"

Young People are suing the Trump Administration over Climate Change. If all goes as planned, Ms. Olson will deliver her opening argument on Monday next week in a landmark federal lawsuit against the Trump administration on behalf of 21 plaintiffs, ages 11 to 22, who are demanding that the government fight climate change: The youngest of the plaintiffs, Levi Draheim, will be just 33 in 2040

The Chinese government is trying to hijack one of this year's hottest social trends for its own propaganda purposes. For months, young people across China have been posting images of themselves pretending to fall out of cars or trip, spreading their expensive belongings in front of them, as if they've just casually fallen out of their pockets:

It's called the "flaunt your wealth" challenge

More than 120 children's organisations have united to urge the government to stop "ignoring children" and to put them at the heart of spending plans. They have written to the prime minister and the chancellor, asking them to recognise that support services are "at breaking point":

"Services and support that children and young people rely on are at breaking point"

Massive increase in children's services statutory responsibilities under Conservative government. The number of statutory duties that councils have in relation to children's services has risen by nearly 100 under the Conservative government, it has emerged:

"This is in stark contrast to a 50 per cent reduction in funding for local authorities since 2010"

PM launches Government's first loneliness strategy. Prime Minister Theresa May launches Government's first loneliness strategy:

"Loneliness is one of the greatest public health challenges of our time" Theresa May said

Britain has created a crisis in childhood, says former children's commissioner. Sir Al Aynsley-Green has written a hard-hitting book that he hopes will shame politicians and spark a national debate: "Childhood is being ruined and the education system under Theresa May's government is largely to blame"

Reports and Studies

Vulnerable young people offered financial education cut their debts by 60% - while their peers see borrowing rise by 50%. Investing in the financial education of vulnerable young people has a dramatic effect on their financial wellbeing, new research has found:

Every £1 spent on financial education for vulnerable young people created £5.57 in social value

Health

One in three secondary school pupils 'has mental health problem'. *Action for Children* said 33 per cent of pupils surveyed have mental health and emotional problems. The children's charity surveyed 5,555 secondary school pupils across the UK aged between 13 and 18:

"Getting help early can help stop some mental health problems in their tracks"

Young people are more sceptical of vaccinations than older generations, with faith in the flu jab particularly low, a European Commission report has found. This is compounded by the rapid spread of health myths on social media, are thought to be driving complacency and scepticism:

Low trust in vaccinations is responsible for the rise in measles outbreaks across Europe

Baroness Tyler: Lives at risk through Chronic Underinvestment in Children and Young People's Mental Health Services. Last week *Action for Children* reported that 1 in 3 young people suffer from mental health problems: "65% of Young People are not able to access the care that they need"
