FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE FOR CHEEKY LITTLE MONKEYS

Figurative language is speech or writing that departs from normal meaning or sound to create a special effect.



Alliteration

The repetition of a sound in a sentence or series of sentences.

Example:

Sarah sang as she skipped down the street.



Hyperbole

Hyperbole may also be used for instances of such exaggerations for emphasis or effect. Example:

The bag weighed a tonne!



Metaphor

A comparison between two things that are not alike and replaces the word with another word.

Example:

The classroom was a zoo.



Simile

A comparison between two things that are not alike and replaces the word with another word AND uses the word like or as

Example:

He was as busy as a bee.



Personification

Personification is when you assign the qualities of a person to something that isn't human or, in some cases, to something that isn't even alive.

Example:

The stars danced playfully in the moonlit sky.
