As a long standing customer, Pulsar Instruments approached Contract Production in 2012 during the early design stages of their new Nova range of sound level meters. Test and production engineers from Contract Production worked with Pulsar's design engineers to maximise the number of machine placed components and offer the most economic assembly solution. This multi layer circuit board incorporates BGA devices alongside QFN and other fine pitch devices.

Small batches of prototypes boards were assembled and tested with feedback given by both sides at every step of the process. This helped to ensure inspection processes, tooling and test equipment were all in place for the product launch in mid-2013.

Industry Focus

EEF 2015 Executive Survey

The latest annual survey published by EEF, formerly the Engineering Employers' Federation, indicates that firms are cautiously confident for 2015. There is confidence that the positive trends of 2014 will remain, albeit the pace of growth companies are planning for is more modest and that feeling of optimism is less prevalent than it was this time last year." Global conditions are of concern with over 1/3rd expecting them to worsen.

On a positive note, 70% of manufacturers say that the UK will be a competitive location for their activities in 2015 with 69% expecting to improve productivity. More than half (58%) expect to boost UK sales with just under half (49%) expecting to take on more permanent staff.

With ongoing economic and geo-political uncertainty, Europe and the Middle East are seen as less promising for exporters. North America, Asia and South America are expected to be the hotspots for export growth.


Have You Seen The Changes?

For anyone who did not make it to our Open day, throughout 2014 Contract Production made a number of improvements to infrastructure, processes and systems to ensure that our customers will continue to receive the highest quality of product. These include:-

In Line Automated Optical Inspection

We continue to invest in our machine capacity and recently installed a new

inline AOI alongside one of our surface mount machines. Whilst being faster than human inspection methods it is also



considered to be more accurate. The AOI checks components values and positional accuracy from the start of a batch run through to completion.

Enlarged Stores Area – As our business grows in size and variety we have had to find space, not only for electronic components, but also housings, cables and turned parts. By rearranging our work space we have consolidated 3 small stores areas into one consolidated space.

Sage Manufacturing Rollout – In

the middle of 2014, we made the changeover to Sage Manufacturing to integrate all of our stock control and management accounts systems. Sage allows us to better integrate how we plan our production, eliminating waste and improving lead times for our customers.

We will continue to add features through 2015 to further enhance information flow to our customers.
