HIGHLIGHTS OF BELARUS (8 DAYS / 7 NIGHTS)

DAY I. MINSK

Arrival. Minsk city tour. We warmly welcome you in Minsk - one of the last undiscovered secrets of Europe, a green city with a cosmopolitan and bustling atmosphere, bright, clean and safe. DAY 2. VITEBSK - POLOTSK

Transfer to Vitebsk and Polotsk. Sightseeing tour in Vitebsk (974), which is known today as the cultural capital of Belarus. The city has a number of historic places of interest including the Palace of the Governor and the Old City Hall, Holy Resurrection Church, the Monument to 1812 War Participants. Vitebsk is also known as the birthplace of the outstanding artist Marc Chagall and you will have a chance to visit his Home-Museum and Art-Center. After lunch transfer to Polotsk. Overnight in Polotsk.

DAY 3. POLOTSK - GRODNO

After breakfast, city tour in Polotsk - the oldest city in Belarus (862). During the sightseeing tour you will visit magnificent St.Sofia Cathedral, Spaso-Euphrasinia monastery (1120), the museum of Belarusian book-printing. After lunch, transfer to Grodno. En-route visit to authentic Belarusian village. Traditional Belarusian dinner with national cuisine and samogon (moonshine). Folklore show. Overnight in Grodno.

DAY 4. GRODNO - RUZHANY - BREST

Sightseeing tour in historical capital Grodno - the "medieval pearl" of Belarus. City tour includes Roman-Catholic St. Francis Ksavery Church, the Old and New Castles, Castle street, Kolozhskaya church (12th century) and other sites. Transfer to Brest. En-route visit to Kossovo Palace (19th century) and Ruzhany to see the remains of Sapega family palace and listen the story of old Belarusian noble families. Overnight in Brest.

DAY 5. BREST

Visiting National Park Belovezhskaya Pushcha (UNESCO World Heritage list) - the last primeval forest remained at the European Plain territory. Enjoy the diversity of its unique wild life including 600-years old oaks and the largest population of rare European bison (driving tour and visit to the Museum of Nature). Then transfer to Brest. Sightseeing tour at the "western gates" of the country - the city of Brest. Visiting the "Museum of Confiscated Art" and heroic Brest fortress. Overnight in Brest.

DAY 6. BREST - NESVIZH - MIR - MINSK

Transfer to Minsk. En-route visit to the greatest treasures of the Belarusian past - Nesvizh Palace (16th-17th cent.) and Mir Castle (15th cent.). Both castles are included into the UNESCO World Heritage list. Arrival in Minsk. The afternoon offers optional visit to the famous Belarus National Opera and Ballet Theater. Overnight in Minsk.

After arriving city tour in Vitebsk (974) - the cultural capital of Belarus. The city has a number of historic places of interest including the Palace of the Governor and the Old City Hall, Holy Resurrection Church, the Monument to 1812 War Participants. Being the birthplace of the outstanding artist Marc Chagall, Vitebsk gives opportunity to visit his Home-Museum and Art-Center. Overnight in Vitebsk.

DAY 4. VITEBSK - BELARUSIAN FARMSTEAD

In the morning transfer to the traditional Belarusian farmstead. Meeting local people, exploring surroundings, tasting Belarusian national cuisine. Optional folk show with national music and dances. Overnight at the farmstead.

DAY 5. BELARUSIAN FARMSTEAD - POLOTSK - MINSK

Transfer to Polotsk, Sightseeing tour in Polotsk - the oldest city in Belarus (862). During the sightseeing tour you will visit magnificent St.Sofia Cathedral, Spaso-Euphrasinia monastery (1120), the museum of Belarusian book-printing. Transfer to Minsk. Overnight in Minsk.

DAY 6. MINSK - MIR - BREST

Transfer to Brest. En-rout visit to Mir to see the magnificent "medieval flower" of the Mir Castle (UNESCO World Heritage) - the unique blend of Gothic, Baroque and Renaissance architecture built at the end of the 15th century. Overnight in Brest. DAY 7. BREST

In the morning sightseeing tour at the "western gates" of the country - the city of Brest. Visit to the "Museum of Confiscated Art" and heroic Brest fortress memorial. Free time in Brest. Overnight in Brest.

DAY 8. BREST - BELOVEZHSKAYA PUSHCHA

Transfer to the National Park Belovezhskaya Pushcha (UNESCO list) - the last primeval forest remained at the European Plain territory. Enjoy the diversity of its unique wild life including 600-years old oaks and the largest population of rare European bison (driving tour and visit to the Museum of Nature). Free time. Overnight at the hotel in Belovezhskaya Pushcha.

DAY 9. NESVIZH - MINSK

Transfer to Minsk, En-route visit to Nesvizh - a delightful historic town and hereditary territory of the noble Radziwill family. Sightseeing tour includes one of the world earliest Jesuit baroque churches - the Corpus Christi Church and Radziwills "family nest", the Nesvizh Castle (16th-17th centuries) (UNESCO World Heritage list). Overnight in Minsk.

DAY 3. MIR - NESVIZH - MINSK

The day offers optional tour to the greatest treasures of Belarusian past - Nesvizh Palace (16th-17th cent.) and Mir Castle (15th cent.). Both castles are included into the UNESCO World Heritage list. Arrival in Minsk. The evening offers an optional dinner at folk Restaurant Gambrinus. Overnight in Minsk.

DAY 4. MINSK - VILNIUS

Free time in Minsk. Optional tour to Skansen-type museum of Traditional Belarusian Architecture in Ozertso. In the afternoon we are driving 180 km to reach Vilnius. Overnight in Vilnius.

DAY 5. VILNIUS

Sightseeing tour in Vilnius - the city with more than 1200 medieval buildings and 48 churches. Panoramic overview of landmarks and short hike around the Old Town with Vilnius Cathedral, Gediminas Tower, Peter and Paul Church, etc. The afternoon offers an optional tour to the medieval capital of Lithuania - Trakai with well-preserved Trakai Castle beautifully located on the island. In the evening enjoy optional folklore dinner at Restaurant Belmontas. Overnight in Vilnius.

DAY 6. VILNIUS - RIGA

Transfer to Riga. A stop at the Hills of Crosses, one of the most holy sites of Catholic Lithuania. After crossing into Latvia visit to magnificent Rundale Palace, the former summer residence of the Duke of Courland. Then travel through the rolling hills of Southern Latvia to reach Riga late afternoon. Overnight in Riga.

DAY 7. RIGA

Optional morning tour to the stunning scenery of the Gauja National Park and the town of Sigulda. Visiting the ruins of the Episcopal Castle and the Castle of the Knights of the Sword. After returning to Riga - optional tour to the Ethnographical Open Air Museum, a spacious exposition of the 18th century country life. In the evening - optional organ concert at the Dome Cathedral.

DAY 8. RIGA

Riga city tour brings a true kaleidoscope of various architectural styles. The walking tour around the Old Town (founded in 1201) includes Riga Castle, Dome Cathedral, St. Peter's Church and other landmarks. The afternoon is reserved for an optional visit to the vibrant Latvian sea resort Jurmala. Optional Latvian dinner at the stylish Restaurant Forest. Overnight in Riga.

DAY 9. RIGA - TALLINN

Transfer along the coastal highway to the Estonian summer resort of Parnu. Short tour in Parnu. Then driving through the North Estonian land of forests, Arrival in Tallinn early afternoon. Overnight in Tallinn.

DAY 10. TALLINN

The craftsmen will be happy to demonstrate their skills and guests are also invited to participate in the work sessions! Overnight in Minsk.

DAY 3. MINSK - MIR - NESVIZH - BREST

Transfer to Brest. En-route visit to the greatest treasures of the Belarusian past - Nesvizh Palace (16th-17th cent.) and Mir Castle (15th cent.). Both castles are included into the UNESCO World Heritage list. Overnight in Brest.

DAY 4. BREST - BELOVEZHSKAYA PUSHCHA

DAY 5. BREST - WARSAW

Transfer to Warsaw through Belarusian-Polish border. Upon arrival Warsaw city tour: visiting Jablonowski Palace, the Royal Castle, walking around the Old Town (UNESCO Heritage Site) and the New Town landmarks: the Krasinski Palace, the Monument of Warsaw Uprising; sightseeing of the Town Hall, Umschlagplatz and the Monument of Heroes of Ghetto, etc. Transfer to the Lazienki Royal Park. Overnight in Warsaw.

DAY 6. WARSAW - KRAKOW

Excursion to Wilanow Palace - one of the most beautiful architecture monuments in Warsaw called "The Little Versailles". The typical baroque palace is remarkable for its original architecture, a blend of the European art with the Old-Polish building tradition. Transfer to Krakow - the former capital of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth. Overnight in Krakow

DAY 7. KRAKOW - WIELICZKA

During the morning sightseeing tour in Krakow you will see Barbican and defensive walls with Florian's Gate, the Main Market Square, St Mary's Church and Town Hall Tower. Then we would proceed to the Jagiellonian University, pass by the Archbishop Palace, St.Andrew's Church to reach the Wawel Hill. Visiting Wawel Castle (c.a. 13th century). Transfer to Wieliczka - the most beautiful and oldest operating salt mine in the world (UNESCO Heritage Site). Wieliczka brings visitors to magnificent chapels, charming underground lakes, excavated chambers adorned with beautiful sculptures made of salt and original mining tools and equipment. Overnight in Krakow.

DAY 8. KRAKOW

DAY I. MINSK

Arrival at the airport, optional transfer to the hotel, welcome meeting. Overnight in Minsk.

DAY 2. MINSK

The morning sightseeing tour in Belarusian capital - Minsk takes us to the amazing collection of Stalinist Classicism architecture at Independence Avenue, the architectural ensemble of the Upper Town of the 17th - 20th centuries, the Island of Tears, maze of narrow streets at the Trinity Suburb, Victory square and the National Library of Belarus. The afternoon offers optional visit to the Skansen-type museum of Traditional Belarusian Architecture in Ozertso. Overnight in Minsk

DAY 3. MINSK - MIR - NESVIZH - BREST

Transfer to Brest. En-route visit to the greatest treasures of the Belarusian past - Nesvizh Palace (16th-17th cent.) and Mir Castle (15th cent.). Both castles are included into the UNESCO World Heritage list. Overnight in Brest.

DAY 4. BREST - BELOVEZHSKAYA PUSHCHA

In the morning sightseeing tour at the "western gates" of the country - the city of Brest. Visiting the "Museum of Confiscated Art" and heroic Brest fortress memorial. Then transfer to the National Park Belovezhskaya Pushcha (UNESCO list) - the last primeval forest remained at the European Plain territory. Enjoy the diversity of its unique wild life including 600-years old oaks and the largest population of rare European bison (driving tour and visit to the Museum of Nature). Overnight in Brest.

DAY 5. BREST - LVIV

Transfer to Ukrainian border and then to historical Lviv city. En-route explore the romantic green 4 km arch of the "Tunnel of Love" near town Klevan. Overnight in Lviv.

DAY 6. LVIV

After breakfast, sightseeing tour in the heart of the Western Ukraine - the "City of Lions" - Lviv. You will enjoy its architectural landscape the incorporated monuments of numerous styles and different epochs: from gothic 14th century Latin Cathedral to baroque St.George Cathedral. Renaissance-style Bernadine Monastery and Chapel of Boimes co-exist here with the strict simplicity of Armenian Church and Austrian period gorgeous picturesque dwellings. Every building in the city center is inimitable in its originality. Overnight at Lviv.

DAY 7. LVIV - KIEV

Early in the morning transfer to Kiev, the capital of modern Ukraine and the "mother city" for all Eastern Slavic people. After lunch Kiev city tour starting at Ukrainian oldest St.Sophia Cathedral (UNESCO World Heritage List). Visiting ancient Golden Gates, St.Andrew's Church (designed by Rastrelli), pedestrian Andrew's Ascent connecting aristocratic strongholds of the Upper City and the mercantile center of Podil, along with other city landmarks. Overnight in Kiev.

DAY 8. KIEV

Morning tour to the golden-domed Kiev-Pechersk Lavra Monastery, the most famous sightseeing in Kiev (UNESCO Heritage List). You will visit caves where monks lived and where they were buried in ancient necropolis. The combination of cool temperatures and humidity turned bodies into mummies that could be watched in wall niches. Lavra monastery also contains numerous churches, towers, printing workshops, miles of underground tunnels with multiple churches inside and one of the richest historical treasuries in Ukraine. Overnight in Kiev.

DAY 9. KIEV

Transfer to Kiev airport and departure.

The magnificent "medieval flower" of the red brick Mir Castle is a unique blend of Gothic, Baroque and Renaissance architecture, built at the end of the 15th century. The castle, owned by a number of noble families in 16th - 20th centuries, is an impressive architectural monument included into UNESCO World Cultural Heritage list.

NESVIZH PALACE

The famous Nesvizh palace is a former residence of the aristocratic Radziwill family, which also includes beautiful park and Roman-Catholic baroque Church of the 16th century. The Palace complex once numbered around 170 rooms with a series of underground passages connecting it to Nesvizh monasteries today is a part of UNESCO World Cultural Heritage and the most popular museum in Belarus.

LIDA CASTLE

Lida Castle (1320 - 1330s) is one of the earliest brick castles in the Grand Duchy of Lithuania with design typical for the early state-owned castles of that period. Lida castle walls survived through many historical events including Teutonic Knights attacks (14th century), Russian Cossacks assaults (1655-1659) and Swedish siege during the Great Northern War (1702 - 1708). Today also hosts cultural events and medieval reconstruction festivals.

BELARUSIAN ETHNOGRAPHY

DUDUTKI FOLK CRAFTS MUSEUM

Dudutki is a former country landowner's estate, where daily lifestyle typical for a hundred years ago Belarusian village has been impressively restored. Today it is a popular open-air museum displaying traditional Belarusian crafts: carpentry, pottery, braiding, blacksmithing, bakery and even cheese-making. The craftsmen will be happy to show off their skills and guests are also welcome to join the masterclass!

MUSEUM OF FOLK ARCHITECTURE AND RURAL LIFESTYLE

Skansen-type museum in Ozertso village displays authentic Belarusian rural architecture of the 18-19th century. Farmsteads, wooden churches, schools, public barns, mills, smithies, stables - all elements have been brought here from different ethnic regions all over Belarus and were carefully restored. Visitors will also enjoy a wide collection of various household, trade and handicraft items that are exhibited at the museum.

MILITARY HISTORY

STALIN LINE

Stalin Line is an open-air museum of military fortifications, including the defensive line with trenches, anti-tank obstacles, ditches and machine-gun pillboxes. Visitors can walk around a pillbox and take a sit at the gun emplacement, stroll along the trench system, have a tank ride or shoot from different types of weapons. The guides are dressed in uniforms of the WW II period. The museum houses a rich collection of military weapons of the 20th century.

WORLD WAR II MUSEUM

The first museum in the world opened in 1944 to reveal the story of this disastrous war. The museum first exhibits were partisan chronicles, handwritten books, handmade weapons. Today the museum, which occupies an area of 3000 sq.m., houses more then 8000 exhibits, including combat reports, diaries, flags of military units, uniforms, military weapons, vehicles and other items.

BREST FORTRESS

The main Brest city attraction is the Brest Fortress which preserved a long time against Nazis' attacks in June 1941 and was ruined in the result of severe battles. Only a handful of men had survived but the heroism of Brest fortress defenders is still remembered by the citizens of the ex-USSR. Today it is a giant deeply-affecting memorial complex.
