





The fired two candidates in next month's Hampton Wick byelection might be outsides but are hoping to upart the odds. The vote was triggered after Tansa

Mathies stepped down from Richmond Council following her victory in the General Election in Twickenham.

Ukip's Sam Naz has announced her conditions, just one mouth after she fin-ished but out of all Richmond Pools and north Kingston conditions in the gener-

al election.

Having lived in Richmond since 2008,
Ms Naz abo stood for Ukip in Ham, Pe-tersham and Richmond Riverside ward. in the 2014 local elections, finishing 11th out of 13 condicates.

She said: "I will meet local concerns about the need for safer streets by fight-ing to get more policemen on the beat where they can be soon.

The main assues she is campaigning on are safer streets, better schools and priority for local people for local hous-



Ukip has yet to luve a councillor elect-Ukip has yet to have a committee code in Richmond and its only previous representative on the council was when Camerontive Soot Norther defected. Whitton blogger Mike Lloyd is the final condidate in the July 2 byelection,

standing independent of any party.

The previously lived in Hampton Wick before moving to Whitton, where he has campaigned on issues such as the mod-ermention of public toilets and services



for deaf children in Richmond.

He said: "Communication is the key to being a successful campaigner."

"And with today's social media channels available to almost everybody, there is no reason why the public campaigner." there is no reason way the punce can not be kept informed about what is going on with their case.

Mr Lloyd has previously served as a councilier in Trowbridge, the county town of Wilsshire.





Parks

South West London has plenty of choice for parks, so pack a picuic, grab the tennis rackets and head to one of our local parks; Richmond Park, Bushy Park, Wimbledon Common, Battersea Park, Clapham Common, Wimbledon Park and Nousoch Park are just a few of our finest.

Rivers

Get a bit of exercise and hop on your bike, grabbing your helmet first, of course. The Thames route has substantial cycle paths, one of the best areas following the non-tidal section of the river from Hampton to Teddington Lock.

If you fancy being a bit more adventurous then board a train into Central London, and test out one of Boris' bikes. It is only £2 for one hour cycling round the landmarks, and there are hundreds of docking stations to choose from.

Geocaching

If you find yourself bored one afternoon, then check out Geocaching, All you need is a GPS device, which most smart phones come equipped with, although they aren't always accurate, which can be part of the fun.

Geocaching involves finding objects, usually film canisters, and writing your name in the little booklet inside. Type your postcode into the website and get hunting!
