# We can help you spread the cost of buying a musical instrument for your child if they're under the age of 18

Whether your child is just getting started, or needs a new musical instrument to move to the next level, then Take it away may have the answer.

Arts Council England's Take it away scheme has been set up to make musical instruments more accessible to children and young people.

It works by letting you spread the cost of buying a musical instrument for your child with an interest free loan of between £100 and £2,000.

You'll need to pay an initial deposit of 10%, and then pay the rest back in 9 monthly instalments – completely interest free. You'll also need to complete a customer declaration to confirm the instrument is for a child under the age of 18.

Some retailers offer longer repayment terms on higher value instruments up to £5,000. The scheme is also open to young people aged 18-25 who can apply for a Take it away loan in their own right.
