Homework- We have asked you to invest in 4 Homework books this year at a cost of £9 for the four, (Grammar, Spelling and 2 Maths books), they will stay in school until they are required to support the learning in class. The books will be used out of sequence and each week the pages or exercises that support the work in class will be provided to your children.

Home reading: Please ensure that your child is reading for 20-30 minutes every day. Parents are expected to sign their childs home contact book at least three times a week. After listening to your child read, we would also be happy to read your comments. On other days, children should keep a record of their reading by noting down the name of the book and the date they read in their home contact journal. Please ensure your child brings their home contact journal to school every day.

Curriculum Subjects: Year 4 children will be experiencing a wide and varied curriculum this half term. Refer to the sheet on the other page for an overview of each subject. Our main topic is 'What's that sound?' which is a vibrant science based unit about the Sounds all around us. We will also link this to our English core text in Autumn 2 'Leon and the Place Between' where children will explore the sound and wonders o the circus.

#### Intervention

Reading Eggs and Mathletics are both programmes to support learning. All children have their personal login details to access them. Please encourage your child to login in daily and complete these home learning activities. Constant use supports their progress in Maths and Literacy. Teachers access the platform to check usage and assess progress.

**School Uniform:** It is essential that all children come to school in the correct uniform; yellow polo shirt, navy jumper, grey/navy skirt or trousers. Children must wear black school shoes.
