2 October 2018

A FANTASTIC WOMAN 15 F OSCAR WINNER Sebastián Lelio, Chile, 100 mins, Drama

Marina, a transgender woman, is shocked when her older boyfriend dies. She is treated with suspicion by his family who suspect she was somehow involved in his death. She has to battle the same forces she has spent a lifetime fighting to become the woman she now is.

16 October 2018

THE NILE HILTON INCIDENT 15

Tarik Saleh, Morocco, 106 mins, Crime, Drama

Set against the backdrop of the Egyptian Revolution, a police officer investigates the murder of a woman. What seems to be a killing of a prostitute turns into a complicated case involving the elite of Egypt.

30 October 2018

GLORY 12A FF

Kristina Grozeva and Petar Valchanov, Bulgaria, 97 mins, Drama A reclusive railway worker finds millions in cash on the tracks and hands the money in to the police. When he's used as a diversion from a scandal, his simple life falls victim to the chaos of bureaucracy.

13 November 2018

THE WOUND 15

John Trengove, South Africa, 86 min, Drama

A coming-of-age narrative set in a remote community in South Africa. A challenging film that deals with circumcision and the related issues of masculinity, sexuality and community.

27 November 2018 HUMAN FLOW 12A

Ai Weiwei, Germany/US, 135 mins, Documentary

More than 65 million people have been forced from their homes to escape famine, climate change and war. In the course of an eventful year, this documentary follows a chain of urgent human stories and gives a powerful visual expression to this massive human migration.

11 December 2018 LOVELESS 15 F OSCAR NOMINATED

Andrey Zvyagintsev, Russia, 122 minutes, Drama

A 12 year old boy is at the centre of this compelling drama about the bitter separation of his parents. Haunting and horrifying, the director of Elena and Leviathan presents presents a contemporary Russia with uncaring authorities and a coldness that pervades all social interactions.

8 January 2019 UNDER THE TREE 15 F

Hafsteinn Gunnar Sigurðsson, Iceland, 89 min, Drama, Comedy It may only be a large tree that casts a shadow over a sunroom, but in a country where trees don't grow, you want to protect the one you've got! From the production stable that made Rams, this is a film for those who enjoy twisted Nordic humour and irony.

22 January 2019 **SWEET COUNTRY 15**

Warwick Thornton, Australia, 109 mins, Western, Drama

A sympathetic settler 'lends' his Aboriginal employee 'a black stock' to his new neighbour. Tensions rise and the employee shoots his temporary employer; echoes of the western in a barren and hostile landscape.

5 February 2019 **BIRDS OF PASSAGE TBC FFF**

Christina Gallegos and Ciro Guerra, Colombia, 125 mins, Drama

During the marijuana bonanza, a violent decade that saw the origins of drug trafficking in Colombia, Rapayet and his family get involved in a war to control the business. It ends up destroying their lives and their culture.

19 February 2019 WESTERN 12A F

Valeska Grisebach, Bulgaria, 116 mins, Drama

German construction workers start a tough job in a remote part of Bulgaria. The language barrier and cultural differences force them to confront their own prejudices and mistrust. A showdown with the locals becomes inevitable

5 March 2019

BEAST 15 F

Michael Pearce, UK, 102 min, Drama, Thriller, Mystery, Crime

A deliciously dark psychodrama set in the pastoral location of Jersey. Beast is part modern gothic fairy tale and part crime thriller. A genrebusting, innovative film with a fine cast and a stand out performance from rising star, British actress, Jessie Buckley.

Billy Wilder, US, 121 mins, Comedy, Romance

Two struggling musicians witness the St. Valentine's Day Massacre. Needing a quick escape, they disguise themselves as women to join an all-girl jazz band and go on the run, with the mob in hot pursuit.

COLD WAR 15 F BEST DIRECTOR CANNES

Paweł Pawlikowski, Poland, 88 min, Drama, Romance

Set against the backdrop of post 1945 Poland, two ill-matched lovers have to decide whether to break free to the West. Shot once more in black and white and with an eclectic soundtrack, Pawlikowski's (the director of Ida) latest offering has met with universal acclaim.

16 April 2019

HAVE A NICE DAY 15

Jian Liu, China, 77 mins, Crime, Animation

Animated neo-noir: in southern China, impoverished Xiao Zhang steals a million yuan from his shady uncle to repair his girlfriend's botched plastic surgery. Uncle wants it back. Others want it too. Follow the money from one dodgy character to the next.

30 April 2019 DISOBEDIENCE 15 F

Sebastián Lelio, UK, 114 mins, Drama

A woman returns to the Orthodox Jewish community that had shunned her in the past for her attraction to a female childhood friend. Once back, their passions reignite as they explore the boundaries of faith and sexuality.

14 May 2019 LEAVE NO TRACE PG FFF

Debra Granik, US, 109 mins, Drama

Will and his teenage daughter, Tom, have lived off the grid for years in the forest. They are 'caught' and put into social services. After clashing with their new surroundings, Will and Tom set off on a harrowing journey back to their wild homeland.

WINCHESTER SCENCE CENTRE AND PLANETARIUM











Winchester Science Centre and Planetarium is an under-cover, allweather family-friendly attraction run by an educational charity. There are two floors of hands-on interactive science exhibits, designed to spark curiosity and encourage experimentation and discovery. An extensive events programme includes live science shows, holiday club and drop-in activities, space lectures, live performance in the planetarium and more.

The Science Centre is home to the UK's largest standalone planetarium providing an incredible, immersive, 360 degree experience. Fulldome film and live, presenter-led shows are available in the planetarium daily and form part of the Science Centre's special events programme.

Onsite facilities include the Hub Café, Science Shop and outdoor picnic and play area, and direct access is available to the adjacent Butterfly Conservation reserve via a public footpath.

Situated on the A31, three miles east of the M3 (jct. 9 and 10). Open every day, from 10am – 5pm at weekends and during school/public holidays, and 10am – 4pm Mon-Fri during term time.
