THE DEVON NATIONAL VINTAGE TRACTOR ROAD RUN 2016 DRIVER CODE OF CONDUCT

Drivers must have:

- A current and appropriate driving licence
- Valid insurance for the vehicle
- Registration numbers on the tractor and any attached implement

Drivers must always:

- Obey the Highway Code
- Make their vehicles as visible as possible
- · Show consideration to other road users
- Be aware that the general public does not always appreciate how slow a vintage tractor travels -
- Must not obstruct road junctions or private driveways when stationary
- Ensure that their tractor is road worthy, especially the brake and steering systems
- In the event of a breakdown await recovery by the recovery marshal
- Switch off tractor engine when leaving the tractor unattended and remove keys.
- Drive at a sensible speed and must not attempt to overtake other tractors on the run, except in an emergency
- If carrying a passenger on the tractor a passenger seat must be fitted.
- If using a passenger carrying appliance (ie link-box), which is attached to the tractor, please ensure that this appliance is capable of transporting their passengers in fixed seats with safety rails fitted.
- If towing a passenger carrying appliance (ie trailer), please ensure that the said appliance has a safety rails fitted, also fit a safety chain in addition to the normal coupling.

There will be marshals in attendance on the day. It is essential that you obey their instructions

Drivers please note that any unnecessary riding around on the tractors on the site prior to the event will not be permitted. Drivers must stay in designated areas at all times

The code of practice is for the safety of you and those around you.

The organisers accept no responsibility for damage to tractors, road users or other property during the event
