

Starting a Corporation

Corporations have multiple and complex advantages and disadvantages. Things to take into consideration are: issues of income distribution and retention, liability protection, ownership transfer, taxation and legal costs. Like an LLC, a corporation offers a layer of liability protection for the owners. Although, using an attorney to incorporate is not legally mandated, most experts recommend doing so, particularly if it is a multi-member corporation.

Unlike General Partnerships or Sole Proprietorships, corporations cannot be dissolved easily. Small business typically choose to be S- corporations, which pass profits or losses directly to the shareholders, much like partnerships. For more information, talk to your accountant and the <u>IRS</u>.

Federal Note: If you want to protect your business name outside of your state, you will need to register your business name at the <u>US Patent and Trademark Office</u>. For basic information, look at their <u>website for first timers</u>.

File your Corporation at the Virginia's State Corporation Commission by Either:

- Registering online at SCC eFile
- Complete <u>Articles of Organization (Form LLC-1011)</u> and submit the original signed articles with the filing fee in the amount of \$100 to the:

If you are doing business under a name other than your legal business name, you must register for a business name in Isle of Wight County. For example, Jane Doe Catering, LLC is doing business as "Fun Foods."

To register a Business Trade Name with the Clerk of the Circuit Court visit the <u>Isle of Wight County</u> <u>Commissioner of Revenue's office</u> for assistance in completing the form. The form must also be notarized. A Corporation or "LLC" must bring a copy of registered name from the State Corporation Commission.

If your business will be located in the <u>Town of Smithfield</u> or <u>Town of Windsor</u>, please contact the respective town directly regarding business name registration.
