

CNG Public Fueling Station

On April 20, 2017, officials with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) and Cambria County Transit Authority (CamTran) celebrated the opening of the commonwealth's newest compressed natural gas (CNG) fueling station in Johnstown, Pennsylvania. The facility was the first of 29 new CNG stations Love's Trillium CNG will design, build and maintain for numerous transit authorities in Pennsylvania. This is part of a public-private partnership (P-3)contract PennDOT awarded to the company in 2016. The P-3 project will provide CNG to more than 1,600 buses at transit agencies across Pennsylvania, including 22 at the CamTran location. CamTran currently has 7 CNG buses and has 15 more that have been ordered.


These trainings and exercises are done on an annual basis at the Inclined Plane and prove invaluable. Local fire departments





2016-2017 Ridership at a Glance Fixed Route




Paratransit (ADA)




2016-2017 Ridership at a Glance

Reserve-A-Ride/Shared Ride




Seniors 65 and Older



2016-2017 Ridership at a Glance


Inclined Plane Ridership






Johnstown Inclined Plane
