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Dear Parents and Carers,

We would like to request your continuous support in making sure that your child has a successful and enriched learning experience in Year 1. Below are some tips which will help.

Reading

Read with your child for at least 10mins every day. This could be a story before bedtime or sharing the latest news.

Make reading fun! Practice reading in a variety of contexts, these could be; game instructions, TV programmes, favourite food packaging etc.

<u>Homework</u>

Homework books are a fantastic way for you to find out about the things we have been learning in class.

We encourage you to discuss tasks with your child and help them complete their homework to reflect their knowledge.

Literacy Support

Literacy is integral to our lives and allows children to benefit from all areas of school life.

During this term, key grammatical skills which we will be learning and continuously using are as follows; Begin to use capitals, simple sentences, spaces between words and full stops.

You can help your children by having discussions with your child about what they have been learning and supporting them with their writing.

You could also support writing by having fun writing notes to each other, writing emails or letters to family members.

Numeracy Support

We use maths in every aspect of our lives at work, school and in practical everyday activities at home and beyond. Good numeracy is essential to us as parents in helping our children learn. During this term, key skills we will be learning include

- Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number.
- Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words.
- Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals.
- Begin to recognise the place value of numbers beyond 20 (tens and ones).
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.
- Solve problems.
- Identify one more and one less.
- Begin to recognise the place value of numbers beyond 20 (tens and ones).

You can help your child by discussing what they have been learning in school and support them by giving them simple mathematical problems to solve. Look for fun, interactive resources online such as Mathletics.
