



Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy (DDP) Level One

Introducing a Framework for Therapy & Parenting of Developmentally Traumatized Children

About DDP:

DDP was developed by Dan Hughes as an Attachment Focused Family Therapy that is tailored to meet the needs of children who have experienced trauma and loss. This therapy is theoretically based on the models of attachment theory and intersubjectivity, and is consistent with the needs of children and young people who have experienced developmental trauma.

Course Information:

This four day training introduces DDP and the broader framework of Dyadic Developmental Practice within which the therapy is applied. This provides a model of parenting and support as well as a therapeutic approach to helping the children.

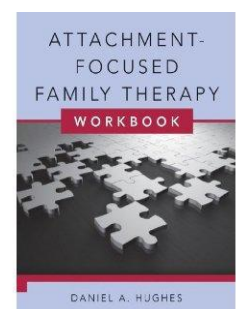
The core components of DDP will be presented and explored through discussion and experiential exercises.

Level one training represents 28 hours of DDP training and will provide the knowledge and practice necessary for attendees to apply DDP principles to their work with developmentally traumatized children and their families.

This level one training is the starting point for certification as a DDP therapist or practitioner

- To understand the DDP framework
- To understand the theoretical foundations of DDP
- To apply this framework to a therapeutic and practice approach for children and parents & parents alone
- To explore the central components of DDP
- To apply the framework to a parenting approach which can complement the therapeutic approach

Professionals who support children and young people who have experienced developmental trauma (social workers working in fostering and adoption services, residential workers and other interested professionals).

Therapists who work with developmentally traumatised children and their families or substitute families.

Vicky passionately believes that when children struggle to feel safe within their foster or adoptive families (due to their early experiences of abuse and neglect within their family of origin) therapeutic approaches which focus on strengthening the child's attachment to his or her new Parents / Carers are the most effective in reducing trauma symptoms and helping children to experience a visceral sense of safety. Vicky believes that it is through the development of nurturing relationships that children can begin to heal from their past traumas. For these reasons, Vicky has specialised in DDP and is committed to supporting others who wish to develop their skills in this approach. Vicky continues to work therapeutically with adoptive and foster families as well as offering DDP supervision and trainings.
