### **Yorkshire & Humber News**

**Yorkshire is struggling to keep hold of its young people.** Kirklees has the second highest levels of workers packing up and moving on. Yorkshire is struggling to hold on to its young people as they look elsewhere in Britain for somewhere to live: A net drain of nearly 10,000 young people last year

**Doncaster schools vastly improved**. Schools across the borough have closed the gap on the national average in all areas and the rate of improvement in Doncaster is greater than that nationally. Doncaster is also the third most improved authority in Yorkshire and Humber:

<u>Dolly Parton Imagination Library boosts literacy in Young People</u>

£1million to improve life skills for young people in Doncaster. Opportunity Scheme launched to offer sports, arts and cultural activities to disadvantaged young people, building character and resilience. Young people from some of the most deprived parts of the town will have access to free extra-curricular activities and healthy meals: <a href="Includes:1550,000">Includes:1550,000</a> to pay for a programme of summer activities in 2018 and 2019

NSPCC says more than 100,000 abused children in Yorkshire & Humber are being "let down" and the charity's findings show 64 per cent of NHS Clinical Commissioning Groups' local mental health plans "failed to properly plan for the needs of abused children."

"Mental health plans for children who've been abused are failing"

#### **Youth Voice Yorkshire and Humber**

Young politicians call for action to stop further fatal stabbings in Sheffield. Members of the Youth Parliament in Sheffield felt there is a direct link between cuts to youth services and the increase in violent crime, particularly knife crime, and have called on the cuts to be reversed:

They highlighted the issue at the UK Youth Parliament annual conference

#### **National News**

Cameron's £1.5bn 'big society' NCS scheme reaching few Young People. Local authorities urge funds be shifted away from the former PM's National Citizen Service to serve council initiated projects:

NCS uses 95% of all government spending on youth services despite reaching relatively few young people

**Labour vows to make provision of youth services compulsory**. The Party also proposes a national body to oversee services for young people in England in an effort to curb rising crime:

Labour is proposing to make it compulsory for councils to provide a minimum level of youth services

**Final Say: More than 1.4m additional young people could vote in new Brexit referendum.** Pro-EU MPs have questioned whether this demographic shift could 'tip the scales' in a fresh poll: "Between 70 and 75 per cent of under-25s voted to stay in the EU in 2016"

**National unit calls for clarity over true scale of child sexual abuse**. The true level of child sexual abuse in England is unclear because police and children's social care services do not collect data on all potential victims, a report has concluded:

"Improvements in data collection are essential if the problem is to be tackled more effectively"

## **Reports and Studies**

**Protected Work Experience: Helping disadvantaged young people into education, training or employment.** For many young people the transition from school to further education or employment can be a difficult one to negotiate. For those with multiple disadvantages the difficulties are far greater: "Even the most severe disadvantages can be overcome"

A Generation Together? What do millennials want from Brexit? Young people are well-informed and want to play their part. Young people have a strong understanding of the complexities Brexit and its potential implications, and want their perspectives to be reflected in the Brexit negotiations:

A thoughtful, funny and frank report about Brexit and Millennials

Young people should get government loans to pay for first house deposit, new report suggests. Housing and Finance Institute puts forward initiatives to increase number of homeowners: "The government cover the cost of a deposit much like the student loan system"

This is the impact *Love Island* has had on young people's self-esteem. One particular point of contention was the topic of body image and the lack of diversity among the islanders' appearances. A survey carried out by BBC 5 Live has revealed this may have had a palpable impact in self-esteem, particularly among younger viewers: "Young people were more likely to consider having cosmetic surgery"

1 in 4 LGBT disabled people (26%) have experienced discrimination or poor treatment in their local LGBT community because of being disabled: Read the report

#### Health

**Young people's mental health is a 'worsening crisis'.** Action is needed. In both the UK and US, services for young people are being cut, leaving those from marginalised groups at greatest risk of suicide:

One recent report called the problem a "Silent catastrophe"

"Home Office figures revealed that **cocaine use among young people is at its highest level for a decade**. "Nearly 9 per cent of 16 to 24-year-olds had used Class A drugs in the past 12 months. Britain has the highest rate of cocaine use among young adults in Europe.

"For every gram of coke they put up their nose, four square kilometres of rainforest are destroyed."

Children as young as 12 to be treated at country's first NHS-funded gaming addiction centre. A group of youngsters picked for the trial are so addicted to games it has kept them off school and harmed their relationships with family and friends:

World Health Organisation announces that gaming addiction is now classified as a mental health illness

## **Grants and Funding**

Home Office doubles size of Early Intervention Youth Fund to £22m. The government's Early Intervention Youth Fund is designed to fund local youth projects that seek to steer young people away from violent crime. It opened for applications today, as part of the Serious Violence Strategy published by the government in April: "Targeted at initiatives that work with under-18s"
