Artcore is a community based visual arts charity operating as a cultural hub, fuelling active engagement for a diverse range of communities in Derby, East Midlands and beyond. Our key objective is to use arts as a tool to strengthen community cohesion, educate, raise awareness and provide a platform to eliminate feelings of solitude and loneliness. We engage with society's most disadvantaged and vulnerable people, by offering inspiring and sustainable programmes in areas where provision is poor and engagement in the arts is low. We reach out to bring positivity and change into the lives of all ages, abilities, culture and ethnic backgrounds through creative practise and skill development.

Artcore offers a contemporary gallery and studio space, providing a fantastic multipurpose platform to exhibit innovative and progressive artwork. For over a decade Artcore has developed strong bonds with local, national and international artists, delivering discussions, residencies, mentorship, artist forums and networking opportunities to both emerging and established artists.

At Artcore, education in general is fundamental to the work we do. We support learning and development in all capacities, and offer a platform for individual progression through volunteering and work experience opportunities.

We believe art acts as a learning tool, breaking down all types of barriers providing a different type of education and knowledge that is accessible to everyone. We support participants to develop their skills using variety of mediums and techniques. Through creative, imaginative and meaningful activities, Artcore offers individuals the opportunity to experiment with creativity, enhance learning and broaden career prospects. These actions in turn nurture relationships and social skills, develop confidence and above all, foster self-worth in all aspects of life.

Overview

It has been a very busy and thoroughly enjoyable year. We are at an exciting and pivotal stage in the development of Artcore since our inception in 2009 in Derby. The organisation feels a great sense of satisfaction that Artcore's methodology continues to support many more people across the East Midlands. The year has been about consolidation and growth and strategical development.

Throughout 2016-17 Artcore has had to adapt to skilful and creative ways to support the arts to demonstrate value across areas of Community, Health and Education.

Despite the current difficult climate, we have continued to diversify our offer and create effective local, national and international partnerships to share resources and ideas, whilst maintaining our core focus. Our newly refurbished site offers a state of the art venue for Art exhibitions and events. Our programmes are stimulating, challenging and impactful. We deliver a number of visual arts programmes, artists' residencies and commissions through our projects, many in partnership with leading arts and voluntary sector organisations. As we look back in this review of 2016, we do so from an anniversary year celebrating 20 years of Artcore. Since its inception in 1995 in India and then in 2009 in Derby, we have worked with many local and international artists, curators, participants and supporting a wealth new commissions and exhibitions for diverse audiences. Artcore has become a cultural and social meeting point with a strong dynamics between the arts, the city and culture of Derby, and everyday life. None of this would be possible without the support we receive, from our donors and funding bodies, volunteers, schools, consultants, Trustees and Patrons, staff, and all Artcore's important stakeholders.

Funding Updates

Celebrating Age: Artcore was awarded £100,000 from Arts Council England to work in partnership with Deda, Derby Theatre, QUAD and other local cultural organisations to produce a citywide programme of activities and events shaped by the interests of older people over three years from 2017-2019.

People's Health Trust: Artcore will be working with Migrant communities over next 2 years from 2017-2018 through 'Our Stories' project funded by Active Communities funding (£40,838) based within the Health Calm Local Society Area.

Elevate: Artcore was successful with 3 years from 2016/17 - 2018/19 sustainability fund form Arts Council England (£149,803) and Tudor Trust (£45,000) to strengthen the resilience of the organisation and increase its capacity to deliver artistic projects. The award has enabled appointment of a new Programme Manager and Finance Officer.


What We Do Art in Modern Culture



Artcore is at the forefront in supporting the artistic community to develop and grow. We provide intelligently curated programmes offering new opportunities for research based artistic projects and the chance to develop new and challenging bodies of work. Our exhibitions are the result of nurturing relationships locally, nationally and internationally, providing contemporary and thought provoking work with artists working in diverse areas.

Dedicated to supporting artists at every stage of their career, we have now expanded our reach. We are able to offer artist the opportunity to exhibit and sell their works online to a worldwide market place through the development of our online Artcore Gallery. Artcore also supports artists through our Art Attachments Project. This is an exciting and motivating artist focused development programme, providing support and encouragement to regional, national and international artist at all stages of their careers.

The umbrella Art Attachments incorporates Bridge the Gap focusing on supported residencies; Art Café Exchange creating informative and enlightened dialogues through debates and discussions; and Platform, giving artist a physical and online stage to promote themselves and their work. Through Bridge the Gap, artists are offered a stimulating and inspiring programme of artist residencies, supporting them to develop artistically and professionally.



Working with our partners, we are able to specific environments and varied platforms for their work; Artcore gallery as a development space for new experimental work: interventional work exhibited within Derby's Museum Collection; subtleties for Air Arts for Derby's Community hospital and occupying the exhibition space at Deda as an integrated part of Derby Festé. Along with an £800 bursary they are offered professional mentorship, and are encouraged to be courageous in their development choices.

Art Caté Exchange has proved to be incredibly successful in connecting and engaging artists in opportunities at all stages of their career. Many artist travel regionally to attend and learn about opportunities and potential collaborations with Artcore and our partners. Through these events, we have created a constantly evolving artist network and have been able to offer financial opportunities to 9 different artists to work with us on a variety of arts based projects. Platform has supported our first Bridge the Gap Artists in Residence, Jason Taylor and Jane Smith, to showcase their new work, inspired and produced during their residency, in a well-received exhibition at Artcore Gallery in February 2017. Artist from our second programme are in the final stages of installation at Derby Museum, previewing on Thursday 13th April. Tracey Meek and Sonia Barrett have interrogated the museum collection to produce a thought provoking body of work.

What We Do Art in Health and Well-being



Artcore fuels art engagement with diverse communities at the margins of society, to support everybody in living an inspiring life. We raise the aspirations and ambitions of people of all ages who face multiple barriers. Our activities are therapeutic for people and help them to keep healthy and active. We work with various groups including older people, people with learning difficulties, physical and mental health problems, dementia and children and adults with special needs. For people with dementia, the world is often confusing and overwhelming. Our projects create a sense of accomplishment, purpose and safety. We provide the person with dementia - as well as caregivers - an opportunity for selfexpression.

Some of the recent projects include: Joys of Creation - a Lottery funded project for people with mental health problems including dementia. Through weekly workshops connecting participants learn techniques in different art mediums. We offer people who might be struggling with loneliness or isolation a creative outlet in a safe space. Participants discover for themselves the ways in which making art in the company of others can be a healing experience that helps improve and sustain wellbeing and health. We provide encouragement, conversation, discussions and allow time to reminiscence. We celebrate achievements and display work in professional spaces, providing a creative platform of expression strengthening local



networks and helping people to live a full and varied life.

Art for Life – an Awards for All funded project we deliver sessions that are innovative and engaging, exploring a variety of art mediums to spark expression.

Keep Active in Normanton – a Lottery funded project for older people. We deliver bi-weekly creative workshops to encourage activity, independence and give purpose to older people of all ethnicities. The sessions are a positive way to keep minds and bodies active. We achieved a number of outcomes all of which benefit the wider community:

- More socially active older people
- Improved community cohesion and friendliness
- Increased confidence, happiness and contentment
- Enhancing feelings of self-esteem and self-worth

What We Do Art in Education and Learning



We encourage and involve people from all ages & abilities into art. Our engagement with various schools, clubs and youth groups, have resulted in great collaborations. We support and enhance skills of young people as they develop their understanding in different visual art mediums. In our workshops participants are encouraged to make independent choices from the design stage to completion.

As well as developing transferable skills such as time keeping, organisation, planning and communication. Artcore also provides a platform to implement learning through volunteering and work experience opportunities.

Some of the recent projects include: Innocence and Expression - funded by the BBC Children in Need, is specifically designed to encourage young people to build confidence, make new friends and embrace their creative sides. Working with a range of children with various needs, the children mix well and work together to create brilliant artworks and performance.

Admire and Inspire – funded by Foundation Derbyshire and the Tom Carey Fund offers young people the



opportunity to join mosaic making sessions working collaboratively to make their neighbourhoods better and break down barriers between Community Centres and Schools in the Abbey neighbourhood. By encouraging people to work together on a collaborative piece to be displayed in the areas we create positive relationships, attract diverse ethnicities, share values and convey culture. We achieved a number of outcomes:

- Increased confidence and creative skills
- Better team working
- More positive aims for the future
- Awareness of art and design in the world
- Ability to try new things and produce art work
- Make new friends
- Visualise and use imagination
- Cultivate pride in themselves and the neighbourhood

What We Do Art in the Community



Community is at the heart of Artcore. Our services are accessible to people from all backgrounds and culture, and of all ages and abilities. We pride ourselves on the inclusivity of our projects and our location ensures our services are accessible to the diverse communities of our locality. Our projects break down the barriers of isolation and separation by enabling people to meet and talk in a friendly environment, to develop a shared understanding. By sharing in a common creativity activity our projects provide a level of inclusion that nurtures a more cohesive and compassionate environment.

Working towards this goal, our **Sharing Celebrations** project brings people together. Individuals have the opportunity to get to know their neighbours by building relationships with people from different backgrounds.

Our Diwali Celebration was a great event with a high turnout. It proved to be a fantastic evening, illuminated with more than 400 (diyas) lanterns. Our Christmas Celebration provided festive refreshments as well as offering the opportunity for the local community to view a celebration of our Creative Dreams workshops. Many activities were on offer to



engage and inspire people, including lantern decorating, face painting, rangoli and canvas drawing. The Artcore building is always used to capacity and is vibrant with colourful, interesting and thought provoking artworks, bringing together people from diverse backgrounds to celebrate community. Continuing to put community first, our **Sharing Celebrations** project will continue throughout 2017.

Our Winter Warmer Creative Health Café gave us the opportunity to reconnect with past participants and organisations we have previously collaborated with. The event was attended by many local communities - residents, health experts and organisations came together to share information, expand people's knowledge, enjoy each other's company and take part in creative activities. Our taster workshop for our Joys of Creation project is specifically aimed at adults with mental health issues, offering them the opportunity to take part in creative activities in a relaxed and friendly environment. All members of the community came and enjoyed each other's company.





Income Pie Chart




