#### Webinar 1

## Producing well written session learning outcomes.

- Why are well written session learning outcomes important?

- How to use the concept of Episodes to support effective session planning.

## Producing an effective Scheme of Work.

- The purpose and different types of Scheme of Work.
- The importance of identifying if learners have necessary prior learning.
- Organising plan content:
  - o remediation activities to accommodate prior subject learning gaps.
  - reinforcement/development of study skills essential to successful completion of the course
  - determining whether a topic or thematic approach would be more appropriate
  - identifying key resources are their availability
  - identifing the most appropriate active learning methods for each topic and sub-topic
  - schedule the learning events with due consideration for specific events such as assignment preparation.
- Developing an Assessment strategy.

#### Webinar 4

## Characteristics of excellent teaching and training sessions.

This subject will be explored specifically through how well learners:

- respond to challenge
- make progress and achieve session learning outcomes
- use of ICT to learn
- use their time and work productively
- demonstrate confidence in what they do and say
- collaborate in learning where it is appropriate for them to do so
- demonstrate critical / evaluative thinking
- contribute to group discussions
- respond to activities focused on the development of Functional Skills, Math skills, and English skills
- demonstrate respect for each other and teachers / trainers
- attend, and the extent to which they are on time and ready to commence learning.

The session will explore how the above are achieved.

# Active Learning techniques to facilitate highly effective learning – Session One.

This session will seek to raise participant awareness of the Active Learning methods identified below and in what contexts they work best.

- Skills Roleplays and Triads.
- Using Poetry and Raps.
- Realia / experiential learning including the virtual world.
- Learner presentations, 'sales pitches', and demonstrations.
- Sorting / post it note type activities.
- Discussion activities including Snowballing, Travellers / Market Place.
- Problem solving tasks.

#### Webinar 6

# Active Learning techniques to facilitate highly effective learning – Session Two.

This session will seek to raise participant awareness of the Active Learning methods identified below and in what contexts they work best.

- Jigsaw learning.
- Cooperation / collaboration games and software games designed to help develop specific skills or enhance understanding of a specific topic.
- Making physical objects and models to develop team working skills or to explain and illustrate ideas, concepts or processes.
- Skills modelling where the tutor demonstrates and explains a skill or behaviour, breaking it down if required into stages.
- Story telling including picture / image stories and allegories and anecdotes.
- Visualisation.

#### Webinar 7

### Learner centred learning.

- What does learner centred learning look like?
- In what learning contexts does LCL work best?
- Five Characteristics of Learner-Centered Teaching.
- Important LCL strategies:
  - o allowing learners to share in decision-making.
  - o believing in learners' capacity to lead
  - o giving up the need for control.

## **Embedding English skills in sessions**

- What does 'embedding' English skills mean and how it can be approached?
- What skills are we talking about?
- What types of learning activities / topics lend themselves well to the incorporation and development of:
  - speaking and listening skills
  - o communicating skills such as verbal summaries
  - o reading skills
  - o writing skills.

Cautionary Note: learner presence in a session is no guarantee they are listening well.

#### Webinar 9

### **Embedding Maths skills in sessions.**

- What does 'embedding' Math skills mean and how it can be approached?
- What skills are we talking about?
- What types of learning activities / topics lend themselves well to the incorporation and development of:
  - measurement / estimation skills
  - basic math skills counting, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, percentages, and ratio.
  - o data analysis skills
  - data representation skills
  - two and three dimensional geometric shape recognition and relationships
  - o other math operations simple formulae, algebra, fractions, decimals, measurement conversions.

#### Webinar 10

## **Classroom Management.**

- The importance of how to create a stimulating learning environment.
- Creating and using ground rules to regulate the learning environment.
- Basic behaviour management strategies.
- How effective organisation of resources and equipment helps to facilitate efficient learning.
- How the visual dimensions of the learning environment can contribute to learning.
- How the organisation of the learning area seating arrangements can enable or inhibit learning.
- How organising who sits with whom contributes to learning.

## Stretch Challenge and Differentiation.
