Tell people all about the benefits of being part of Unite

Many people don't know about the vital work that trade unions do and how they can help. Some don't even know what a trade union is. Use this week to talk to non-members and members about why being part of Unite matters to you. You can tell people that workers in unionised workplaces earn more – up to 10 per cent than non-union members.

Unionised workplaces are safer and stronger, with union members enjoying greater job security and better terms and conditions.

Help spread Unite's three core values: Secure work: fighting for jobs and job security; Strong voice: a union which is respected at work; Decent Pay: a union focused on pay and conditions.

If all of our activists spoke to just one person during unions week we would make thousands of new contacts. You could setup a branch competition to see who makes the most contacts and give a small prize to the winner!
