KGV PUBLIC ART

Public Art to be located in KGV by Kofi Skingley (UoG First Year Journalism Student)

A piece of artwork up to the value of £27,000 is to be constructed in a King George V playing field located in Hesters Way. The artwork is to be installed under the Section 106 agreement linked to Gloucestershire College's construction of student halls for its international students on Devon Avenue.



The agreement that ensures a developer must mitigate the effects of any large development. This can be improvement to roads, pavements or in this case, public artwork. Discussions between the developers, council and the public are in progress to find the best place for the art to be located. The choice of KGV was to make sure it could be seen by students in the flats as well as the local community. It was decided that the King George V playing field would be the best place because it is in between the college and the student halls, but is also easily accessible by non-students. The piece will most likely be located by and replace the single basketball hoop just outside the rugby pitch.

Project manager, Nicky Whittenham, invited local artists to put in a bid to create the artwork and over 30 people applied. The winning bid came from Rob Olins, who held a workshop at the Hesters Way Library on the 11th of February and Rowanfield Juniors in which people could work with him to come up with a design. Rob wanted the public to have a main contribution in initial ideas as it is a pubic piece, imagined by the public themselves.

Consultation for the design has now begun, there will be an event on the 1st of April at the St. Marks and Hesters Way Community Association for further planning and designing so why not pop along and add your views!









JOINT CORE STRATEGY

The Joint Core Strategy (JCS) has now reached 'Main Modifications' stage. These are changes to the 'Pre-Submission' (June 2014) version of the JCS that have been discussed at the hearings with the Inspector and have been considered and agreed by each of the three JCS Councils.


You are now invited to make comments to the Proposed Main Modifications; the consultation relates to the proposed Main Modifications only and not the general content of the plan. Once the consultation has closed, there will be further public hearings as part of the Examination in Public; the exact dates of which are currently unknown.

SPRINGBANK GREENBELT DEVELOPMENTS

As many of the readers of Viewpoint will be aware new proposals have come to light to develop the land to the west of Fiddlers Green and Springbank as part of the JCS, a plan to meet local housing and employment needs. The proposal for a cyber hub (high tech business park) and 1100 residential properties has come about at short notice thanks to the reduction in allocations in other parts of Cheltenham.

There is considerable local outcry about the proposals not least as opportunity and time to comment has been far less than in other parts of the town. Locally there is also issue with the loss of amenity; beautiful



countryside and views, walking routes and access to The House in the Tree pub. This is all the more concerning as the land in question is designated as "safeguarded greenbelt".

The plan shown here is the latest version, which shows the cyber hub in purple, housing in light brown and green spaces in green.

WEST CHELTENHAM NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN

If you have been reading the recent issues of Viewpoint you will be aware that the **West Cheltenham Forum** was set up by residents in February to create a **Neighbourhood Plan** for the West of Cheltenham. This plan will help local people shape new developments for the benefit of the community and will, if adopted by residents at a referendum, be part of planning law! The West Cheltenham Forum has come up with a constitution document for guiding the plan's future development and defined its preferred boundaries for the area with the help of the 70 strong group of local residents, businesses and councillors.

However, the Cabinet at Cheltenham Borough Council turned down the application on the basis that the area would cut across boundaries and includes a number of separate communities which would reduce community cohesion.

With your help and further negotiation between the Forum and CBC they are hoping to get it back on track. Come along to find out more (below)

BT Payphones Saved?

Cheltenham Borough Council (CBC) thanked local residents for their responses to the BT Payphone Removal consultation regarding decommissioning of 27 payphones across the town. Feedback was used by CBC to make a notification to Ofcom on March 13th.

Usage of payphones has fallen by 90% in the past 10 years and studies predictably showed that some local phone boxes had had next to no use in the year to August 2016. Two payphones in the area on Springbank Road and Brooklyn Road had had only 48 calls made from them in the previous year.

However, CBC are proposing to object to the removal of two others; Tennyson Road (672 calls) and Springbank Road (123 calls).

We await the final decision as to whether these payphones will be retained.

We are delighted to announce the start of a new bus route serving the West Cheltenham area. **The "S" route** will commence on March 15th and link Hesters Way, St Marks and Springbank every Wednesday afternoon. This news comes as some consolation to the local community since the loss of the "C" route along Springbank Way. The new "S" bus ((in black on the map) is being provided by Community Connexions thanks to a subsidy from the Gloucestershire County Council. If you hold a **Concessionary Bus Pass** you will be able to travel on the bus for FREE as usual.

The bus will start at **Shelley Road** travel west to Tennyson Road and then Brooklyn Road, past the library to Coronation Square. It will then leave the Square on Marsland Road and head off to the **Springbank Community Centre** via Wentworth, Dunster and Springbank Roads.

On its return from Springbank it will retrace its journey to Coronation Square then following Princess Elizabeth Way to Shelley Road.

So if you want to visit the shops in Tennyson Road or on the Square or the



community centres then the "S" bus could be just the ticket!

The route will link up well with the other local bus services notably at;

- Coronation Square (A and F bus)
- Tennyson Road (F bus)
- Springbank Road (C bus)

RECLAIM RECYCLING LESSONS

Reclaim's furniture re-use scheme does more than deal in used furniture, it offers educational sessions about the importance of recycling. Earlier this month, 3 groups of students from GlosCol's Independent Living course visited Reclaim. They each had a two hour session learning about different types of metals, their uses and how to recycle them. In total, they sorted 67Kg aluminium 55Kg steel cans.

A fourth group did our community a great service by undertaking a litter picking task using our cargo bike along the Honeybourne Line. They removed a full box load of discarded cans and bottles, which apart from being unsightly are a real nuisance as they can cause accidents, attract vermin and kill wildlife.

The students were learning a lesson that many adults still need to be reminded about and that is **we need to recycle as much as possible**. If we do not, then it is a waste of a valuable and finite resource, as well as a waste of energy if raw materials need to be sourced in order to make a replacement and this means tonnes of additional CO_2 unnecessarily going into the atmosphere.



The UK produces over 9 billion drinks cans every year, 80% of which are made from aluminium and the rest are steel. Each and every one could be recycled remade into a new product or another can. In a single year, one aluminium can could be recycled up to eight times and, because the ore does not need to be mined, it saves a tremendous amount of energy, prevents pollution and avoids scarring the landscape.

Every tonne of aluminium recycled saves 4 tonnes of bauxite (the ore from which aluminium is derived) and prevents 9 tonnes of CO_2 emissions, which is a very bad greenhouse gas. Similarly, for every tonne of steel packaging recycled, it saves $1\frac{1}{2}$ tonnes of iron ore from being dug up and 40% of the water needed and 75% of the energy needed to make steel if it were to come from raw materials.

You can **drop off your used drinks cans, foil, wires, keys and even old radiators at the Reclaim warehouse** (Unit 25b Lansdown Industrial Estate, Off Gloucester Road, Cheltenham GL51 8PL) and we will ensure it is properly recycled. 
