The first meeting of the **Neighbourhood Development Forum** took place on 10th February with 20 local residents discussing the first phases of the plan. The introductory meeting facilitated by Andy Hayes of the Hesters Way Partnership teased out some of the key features which will shape how the plan works.

Those attending had to come up with a constitution document **for guiding the plan's future development.** This included agreeing the area that the plan focusses on and its main aims and objectives.

All participants were given the chance to influence the **boundaries of the area** and good arguments were put forward for the boundary to follow the main roads (Tewkesbury Road, Gloucester Road), the river Chelt, the Honeybourne line or main railway line. Some debate involved the inclusion of the Moors estate and Benhall too.

The boundary suggestions were drawn up on maps provided and a consensus will have to be reached before the forum can proceed.

The group then cast its eyes over the suggested aims and objectives documents prepared for the meeting. Most people agreed that the plan should deal with;



- the social, economic and environmental well-being of West Cheltenham
- allocating sites for business, retail and housing development including affordable housing
- solutions for transport, traffic and parking issues
- plans to mitigate against the effects of climate change
- protection for existing buildings/areas of note and worth
- support for local businesses, schools and community spaces such as libraries, community centres and public facilities
- protection of green spaces and bringing environmental benefits to the area.

We will need to **involve as many residents**, **local workers** and **local businesses** in the process as possible and **attract wide support** for the plan so if you'd like to get involved why not come along to the meetings or give us a call.

ALLOTMENTS AVAILABLE in Hayden Lane

heltenham Borough Council is advertising vacant plots on two allotment sites, as waiting lists across the borough continue to shrink. The Hayden Road site is in the north of the town has plots available immediately for Cheltenham residents looking to 'grow their own'.

'This is a great time of year to take on a plot' says allotment officer, Fiona Warin. 'There is still time to clear and prepare the ground before the start of the main growing season.'



She adds that 'some people may have been put off applying in the past, due to the long wait for a plot. We would encourage anyone who is interested to get in touch, as they could get a plot straight away'.



PRIMARY SCHOOL

Across the country, other authorities are reporting a drop in allotment demand. It has been suggested that the decline in the number of television programmes dedicated to food-growing and allotment gardening may be a factor. However, those with

allotments are as enthusiastic as ever, with one tenant at Hayden Road describing her site as 'the best place in the world to spend time, get fresh air, get fitter, grow amazing food and invite friends for a cuppa!'.

Waiting lists in the south of the borough are also falling fast but current applicants might expect to wait a year or more, particularly for the sites with a low rate of plot turnover. Those interested in applying for a plot can go cheltenham.gov.uk and fill in an application form.

HESTERS WAY FINALISTS IN POLICE SCHOOLS FOOTBALL COMPETITION

On Friday 25th September 2015, Gloucestershire Constabulary organised a football competition for schools in Tewkesbury and Cheltenham for children aged 10-11 years old.

The event was sponsored by 'Gloucestershire Community Foundation' and was held at Balcarras School. Each team were given their own individual coloured t-shirts to wear with the logo 'one game, one community'.



Each match was ten minutes long and every match was played in a good spirit. Both groups were tightly fought and the top two places were not decided until the last group matches were played.

In the first semi-final, St Gregorys played Shurdington. St Gregs, successfully secured their way into the final in a close fought match. In the other semi-final, unbeaten Oakwood played Hesters Way School in a much tighter match. **Hesters Way won the close fought encounter 1-0 and went through to the final.**

The final was an intriguing affair - St Gregs finished top of their group. However, Hesters Way had beaten St Gregs in the group match, so the final was set to be an interesting and finely balanced encounter. Hesters Way played well and tried very hard, but St Gregs proved too strong and were worthy winners of the 2015 Community Cup.

Winners and runners up, as well as all those participating, received medals and certificates. Furthermore, each team was awarded a sportsmanship mark (out of 10) after each match during the group stages. After all the group matches were played, two teams



were joint top - Gloucester Road School and Oakwood School. Both teams received the 'Sportsmanship Trophy' after displaying excellent sportsmanship throughout the tournament.

PCSO Wayne Lippett of Cheltenham Neighbourhood Policing said:

"This Community Cup has been a great success over the years all schools thoroughly enjoyed it and hopefully next year the competition will be just as exciting."

ANDREA'S FRESH CHALLENGE LEADS TO A CHANGE OF CAREER

Over recent months we have been working with Andrea to provide advice on her work situation and discuss options for a change of career and we're delighted to hear that she has just started a new job.

This year, Andrea says, "I made a decision to have a new challenge and I applied for a role with PING (Physical Inclusion Network Gloucester) as an Expert by Experience Quality Checker. I've recently started in my new job, which is an opportunity to use my own experience in a different capacity."

PING is commissioned by Gloucestershire County Council to carry out quality checks at residential homes and supported living settings across the county. These checks are to ensure that disabled people who live in these settings are safe, healthy and

happy and that the care they receive is appropriate to their needs.

PING has an excellent policy of ensuring that these checks are peer-led, which means that someone with experience of a long term health condition or impairment will talk to people during these checks and put their findings into the final report. Over the summer, Andrea attended the Forwards Job Club in Cheltenham, which she found very helpful and it was through the job club that she heard about the advertisement for the Expert by Experience job and decided to apply.

Vicci Livingstone-Thompson, PING's Managing Director told us: 'At PING it is really important that we are run by disabled people for disabled people. We are thrilled to have Andrea on the team as she brings a wealth of

knowledge and experience to the quality checking work that we do, along with a fantastic, friendly personality. We feel very lucky to have found Andrea and I know that she will make a real difference to the people we work with.'

At the moment Andrea says it's a busy time, as she's training up for the new role and there's lots to take in. She's also combining it with a voluntary position as a member of the Advisory Board of the National Star College in Cheltenham. She attended the college herself as a student in the 1980's and being on the board is again an opportunity to share her experience and contribute to the lives of other disabled people.



Pate's Pupils Work for the Community

ver the past year, **Pate's Grammar School's Community Committee** has been busy getting involved with weekly volunteering and events in and around the local area.

Last July, our Committee of thirteen Year 13 students invited mothers and their children to a summer picnic held at Pate's as part of our work with the **Family Space** charity. Family Space works to provide a break for parents and gives them a fun and supportive environment for themselves and their children to go to. It was therefore lovely to see the youngsters come and get stuck in with some arts and crafts, treasure hunts and games.

In addition to working with Family Space, the Community Committee promoted and organised the collection of food for **CCP's 'Hamper Scamper'** at Christmas. The Hamper Scamper scheme provides gifts and hampers for some of the county's most disadvantaged children, young people, families and vulnerable adults.

As well as organising events, the Committee runs weekly volunteering opportunities for Year 12 students. We have been delighted to continue our 'Reading with Children' scheme this year. Within this, students from Pate's spend time with local primary school children each week to help support their literacy skills. The schools we work with include Springbank, St. Thomas More, Hester's Way, St. Mark's and Rowanfield. Our sixthformers find this to be a very rewarding experience and it is wonderful to see the children gaining confidence in their reading.

We have also continued our volunteering opportunities for Year 12s at Monkscroft care home. The students support our local elderly residents through several mediums, including musical performances, craft workshops, reading books, and just being there as someone for the residents to talk to.

Cheltenham Neighbourhood Policing Team

Mobile devices allow police officers to spend more time in their communities

Over 800 police officers in Gloucestershire Constabulary are now using new mobile devices to promote a more effective and efficient way of working.

The Samsung Galaxy Note 4 devices, which were introduced across the force area in July 2015, have enabled officers to remain on the beat rather than travel back to police stations to complete paperwork and tasks on computers.

The project, involving over £2 million of investment, means that around 80% to 90% of work that officers were previously completing in an office will eventually be carried out within the community on the touch screen devices. This includes taking statements, issuing vehicle tickets, monitoring emails, arranging calendar appointments, updating incident logs and filling in stop and search forms. Many of the applications have proved vital, such as Google translator when liaising with members of the public who have little or no English. Several

more useful programmes will be introduced onto the devices in the coming months.

Over 20 large retail outlets have agreed to actively promote officers to use their public facilities. The outlets, including Sainsbury's and



Tesco stores across Gloucestershire, are highly supportive of officers using their cafes and restaurants to carry out work on the mobile devices.

Local PCSO Wayne Lippett was one of the officers selected to trial the devices on behalf of the constabulary.

Chief Inspector Neil Smith of Local Policing said: "I think it's one of the greatest practices we've ever introduced and will allow our officers to give the very best service to our communities."



Protect your home from burglars

Reducing the number of dwelling burglaries is one of our strategic objectives. Your local team have been working hard to achieve this. Officers are using local intelligence to apprehend offenders and help residents to protect their homes from burglary.

In recent months in the local area, sheds and garages have been targeted by burglars with door locks being forced.

To make it difficult for burglars to target your home:

- · consider installing a good quality burglar alarm to your property
- · use low level dusk-to-dawn lighting around the outside of your home
- consider using prickly plants as boundaries; criminals do not like climbing through prickly plants and hedges
- consider installing a crunchy gravel driveway; they are a good deterrent as thieves do not like to be heard
- protect your shed install metal grilles over windows, reinforce hinges and invest in a good lock
- consider securing valuable items inside your shed or garage using security cables or chains with robust padlocks
- keep boundary fences and hedges at the front of your property low to allow as much natural surveillance as possible from neighbours, passing pedestrians and traffic
- have a secure boundary at the back garden
- security-mark garden furniture and ornaments and secure them with bolts or fix them to a concrete base with metal pins
- secure expensive plants in the ground with wire and pegs around the root ball Please assist us by reporting any suspicious activity via the **101** telephone number, or by contacting Crimestoppers anonymously on **0800 555 111**.



FUNDING ELIGILIBITY FOR FREE EARLY EDUCATION AND CHILD CARE

It would seem that parents of children, age two plus, are not always sure of whether they are eligible to access 15 hours free child care each week. Whilst there is information available on line, it is sometimes confusing for people to fully understand.

Acting Nursery Manager, Tracey Hyett, from St Thomas More Nursery and Pre-School in Hesters Way explains. "Some two year olds are able to receive free early education and childcare. If their parent(s) receive working tax credits and have an annual income of less than £16,190 before tax,

they may be able to claim for 15 hours of free early learning childcare each week (570 hours a year). They may also be entitled to a funded free place if they meet the eligibility criteria used for free school meals, if their child has a statement of Special Educational Needs or if their child receives Disability Living Allowance. Parents may also be able to claim if they receive Income Support, Jobseeker's Allowance, income-related Employment and Support



Allowance, Universal Credit or support through part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act. If a child is eligible, parents can claim at the start of the term after their 2nd birthday. For example, if the child turns 2 between 1st January and 31st March, they can claim at the start of the Summer term in April. If their birthday is between 1st April to 31st August, they can claim at the start of the Autumn term in September or if their birthday falls from 1st September to 31st December, they can claim at the start of the Spring term in January."

Parents wishing to check their entitlement should contact Gloucestershire Family Information Services on 0800 542 0202 or visit www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/Citizen Portal immediately after their child's second birthday. Once registered parents will receive a letter which they can then take along to an appropriate approved childcare provider or nursery such as St Thomas More.

"We are always happy to help parents who are unsure of their funding eligibility," says Tracy. "With spaces currently available at our nursery for 2, 3 and 4 year olds, we know that many parents are not making use of their

entitlement and would encourage them to do so. When a child turns 3, all 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to 15 hours free funded nursery education a week until they start school."
