Club AGM 2019

2018 has flown by and the Ladies Section goes from strength to strength with 146 ladies of which around 120 are levy-paying members of the section. 30% of our players are in silver division (handicaps between 0 and 20) with 9 ladies having a handicap of 10 or less. I believe this is a record for the club.

The year got off to a poor start weather-wise with the delay of the Captain's Drive in and cancellation of many competitions. In April the Ladies put the pink ribbon on the Ladies versus Seniors Trophy and Lady Captain's weekend Away was held at The Forest of Arden Club with some challenging golf.

We held out Mountney Travelling Trophy at Birstall course in May and in June we had a Purple Par-Tee for Lady Captain's Day. At last in June the weather had improved enough to hold the Captain's Drive in with a special appearance from some royal newly-weds!

In July we had the Rolling Pin competition – again with a pink ribbon on the Trophy – sorry Joe!

In August we had our Summer Meeting with an 80's theme and by now the course was bone dry and the balls kept rolling on as the handicaps plummeted.

In September we had Lady Captain's Away day at College Pines which was a lovely day and we were made to feel very welcome. We then had a cowboys and Indians theme for the annual Captain versus vice-captain battle organised by Cindy but even that we had to foreshorten and declare it a draw as the howling winds brought down trees!

October brought our annual Trick or Treat competition with the Seniors .

In November we had Lady Captains Dinner and presentation evening with a musical theme and were serenaded by a group of male singers called Oldish Spice December saw our mix of Christmas competitions but the weather jinx of 2018 finally caused us to cancel our last Secret Santa competition die to freezing rain !

I must also recognise the achievements of our ladies outside the club itself – Aileen Kynoch was County Vets Captain for 2018, Carol Houghton was County Vice Captain and is now County Captain, Helen Haycox is now County Senior Vice Captain, Charlie Inger was County Juniors Captain and last but by no means least Sarah Mansfield is now County Vets President. We are proud of them all. Our Silver players won County Division B and as such have been promoted to Division A . We also fielded a Scratch team for the first time and came 2nd in our Division

Thanks to nominations by the Ladies section we were also recognised as Ladies Section of the Year by the Surprize Golf shop and Women in Golf Magazine. This was well deserved. As well has having fun during the year we also raised over £2000 for The Friary charity.

I have had a tremendous committee this year who I would like to thank for all their hard work and support. I couldn't have wished for a better team.

I would also like to thank Amanda Fletcher and her team for all their help with events during the year.

A few final thanks – firstly to Joe Timmins, Graham Chambers and Pete Trotter who have been very supportive during a year of mixed fortunes for me and whom I have enjoyed working alongside on the main committee and liaison committee. Finally thanks to my long-suffering mixed partner and sage Colin Brown.

I wish Cindy and Graham the best of luck and a good golfing year in 2019

Financial Commentary

- Income from competition entry fees was in line with recent previous years at £21,500 and other income was slightly higher than recent years due to the contribution towards committee running costs received from NGCC management. This enabled the amount paid out in competition prizes to be higher than previous years.
- 2. The budget plan for the year, as with recent previous years, was to "break-even". However, actual expenditure exceeded income by £1550 resulting in a reduction of the cash surplus held. This overspend was predominantly a result of the mid-year decision to fund a second PSI terminal with the aim of reducing waiting time for members signing into competitions and entering their scores on completion as well as providing back-up facilities in the event that either terminal should require repair.
- 3. The budget for 2018/19 has once again been set to roughly balance expenditure to income.

Treasurer Notes

Once again, I can confirm that we have maintained stict procedures for securing and reconciling the funds we hold in the form of balances on members' competition cards. The competition balances maintained on the ClubV1 system have been successfully reconciled throughout the year against the accounts system and the bank account statements.

I would like to thank Ash Stephenson for his input as auditor for Committee financial records and I can confirm that Ash has approved the Financial Accounts as reported below.

MATCH AND HANDICAP REPORT FOR THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE MEMBERS CLUB AGM ON WEDNESDAY 23 JANUARY 2019

- 1. <u>COMPLIANCE REPORT</u>: In accordance with Appendix L of CONGU, Affiliated Clubs are required to be consistent in their interpretation and application of the Unified Handicapping System (UHS). I can confirm to the membership that as a Club we continue to comply fully with the UHS checklist following a review I carried out on 1 January 2019.
- 2. <u>MATCH & HANDICAP MEETINGS</u>: M &H Meetings are held bimonthly with all sections being represented. Minutes are produced and published from these meetings and are submitted to the main committee for scrutiny and comment.

3. <u>CLUB V1 SYSTEM</u>:

- a. **Purchase of a New PSI Terminal:** The main committee approved the purchase of a new and second PSI Terminal in order to enhance the usability and provide a contingency in case of a PSI Terminal failure. The terminal was located in the Pro shop as it provided a hardwired link into the main club broadband network. Both terminals now provide members with an enhanced score entry facility and improved system graphics.
- b. **Software and Support:** Club Systems continues to provide regular software updates and enhancements to the system albeit that the majority are background functions for admin users. This software continues to be the market leader for golf clubs.

4. MEMBERS HANDICAPS:

- a. **Annual Review (AR):** The AR of handicaps was carried out in December 2018 across all sections of the club in accordance with the directive of CONGU<u>.</u>
- b. **Continuous Handicap Review (CHR)**: M & H committee member's carryout regular reviews of members handicap throughout the year based on the CHR process. A report is run off the system that identifies members who have returned 7 or more consecutive 0.1 increases to their handicap. Notifications of changes are e mailed to members.
- 5. <u>CLUB COMPETITIONS:</u> With the exception of the competitions scheduled for when the adverse weather affected play all competitions ran pretty much to schedule and were very well supported. Minor changes and enhancements to certain events seemed to be well received. The committee will continue to review throughout 2019 and apply changes to support as necessary. Member's suggestions are always welcome in order to promote continuous improvement.
- 6. <u>MANAGEMENT SUPPORT</u>: The M & H Committee would like to acknowledge the support from the Management Team, Green-keeping Staff and Pro Shop Team throughout the year. In particular, with special thanks to Bill Mackenzie for the appreciation and co-operation in supporting changes that have enhanced the playing opportunities for members over the years of his tenure as MD of the Club. Special thanks must also be passed onto the Green-keeping staff for the excellent preparation of the courses for every competition that we play throughout the year. (With the exception of Green-keepers day!)

7. 2019 RULES OF GOLF CHANGES:

- **a. Presentation & Communication:** Following the confirmation of the changes to the Rules of Golf from England Golf, we embarked on a programme of presentations to the membership outlining the major changes. Circa 200 members attended the 3 sessions, providing positive feedback. 600 copies of the New Rules of Golf book for players have been distributed and numerous communications have been e mailed to members outlining and confirming the changes. 2 weeks prior to the implementation of the changes as a club we have trialed the new rules in order to allow members to gain experience and iron out queries.
- **b.** Local Rule Changes: Having reviewed the changes, along with the Director of Golf we have re written the Local Rules and ensured that the changes were incorporated into the printing of the new course cards as well as updating the General Information section at the back of the Club Diary.
- WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM 2020: The M & H Committee will throughout 2019 be monitoring and reporting to members the details of the changes to the handicapping system that are planned to be introduced in 2020.

Junior Report

Competitions

In 2018 we had a total of 13 juniors participate in club competitions. There was lots of excellent golf played. The standard was very high and winning scores would have been very competitive in any of the adult matches. That is a great reflection keeping in mind the modest numbers involved. The season started slowly due to the cancellation of competitions mainly due to the poor wet weather at the start of the year. I was very pleased to manage to get the final competition completed albeit in December

We have benefited from two eager Juniors joining us from another club. One of the challenges in having a healthy junior Section is developing budding golfers who are being coached in the Academy and encouraging them to become active members. Gaining a handicap is often a barrier and I would encourage any members who know of potential youngsters and find an opportunity please get them on to the course – it would be really helpful.

We are also losing three key members of the Junior Section being Harry Boyle , Fergus Boyle and Charlie Inger. They have played a great part in supporting our club. Harry and Charlie will be too old and Fergus has competing priorities .

As Junior Organiser I would like to note their considerable contribution

Matches

We were drawn against Rushcliffe, Mapperley and Rufford. Personally I really enjoy the matches it is great fun to walk the course supporting the individuals in competing in a team on behalf of our club. It was gutting to miss the final by one point. Also we had to concede a point against Mapperley which we drew 2 - 2 and had to record a 3 - 2 loss due to a late withdrawal.

The highlight was a $4/\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$ win over Rufford . Rufford still qualified for the final and went on to win at Wollaton. Their Junior organiser was very keen to update me.

Way Forward

From a personal perspective I am keen to continue to support the Juniors for 2019 I intend to keep the competitions on Sundays. The option is to use half term holidays which is not the preference of the parents. The challenge is that some other sports are on Sundays and therefore you lose participants due to football or Rugby. In half term those on holiday cant attend. On balance Sundays have proved the higher participation although I will review as we progress.

Each year Junior Teams have been withdrawn from competitions for various reasons. Last year Newark and Hollinwell dropped out which caused some concern at a recent Junior Organiser Meeting.

From our perspective we have 10 active Juniors of which 6 can be relied upon. This is very marginal. I would like to encourage the management to provide more support in developing youngster's. As the alternative would put the Junior section at risk.

We have drawn Sherwood, Oakmere and Rufford in the Junior League for 2019. I am hoping for some great matches and seeing the Juniors enjoy their time representing our club.

Mixed Captain's Annual Report 2018

Here we are again at the end of another golfing season – how quickly the months seem to fly by and how much we pack into that time! Here, at the Nottinghamshire, we are incredibly lucky to have such a large, active and friendly mixed section. It is the reason that many folks decide to join our club as in many clubs the mixed sections are dwindling and have very little organised. Luckily we had a good framework for the golfing year in place from its inauguration which we have built on over the years to give members the opportunity to meet and play with fellow golfers in a range of different scenarios whether it be matches, competitions, weekends away, knockout comps or simply the social golf which happens every Sunday with a big group meeting up and going out to play. We have welcomed several new players to the mixed section during 2018 - Yvonne Hoyes and Steve Evans, Vicki Johnson, Pat Casson-Smith and Chris and Angela Bradshaw and Polly Rogers. When new members have joined I always endeavour to personally contact them by email to welcome them and let them know all about the section and how to become involved if they so wish.

We have had a strange season regarding matches this year! We have 15 matches on the calendar, 3 on Tuesdays and 12 on Sundays. This year 3 were cancelled due to very wet weather but 3 cancelled by the opposing teams as they were unable to field teams! With some clubs next year the teams will be reduced to 6 pairs at their request. We have halved 4, lost 3 and won 2. I have always been able to field a complete team to match the opposition thanks to your support. 27 couples represented the Nottinghamshire over 2018. We had to relinquish the trophy to Horsley Lodge, played over the two matches, and only played one of the two Chilwell matches for the Linsco Trophy so that remains with them, despite us winning the match played! My thanks to David Rose, Mark Coyne, Steve King and David Mansfield who have captained teams during the season. Thanks also to Sharon Riddell, our match secretary, who has contacted all clubs and confirmed match details. Next year's match dates are also all confirmed. However Rufford who have always struggled to get a team have decided not to commit to our matches next year.

Our 7 competitions played over the season have been well supported on the whole depending on the time of year. We always have space available for 32 couples and it is always my aim to fill all the spaces allotted to us before relinquishing them back to the club

We all had a very enjoyable day and enjoyed the excellent hospitality shown by the club and its catering team, not to mention Luke, their golf operations manager, who planned the day there for us. On June 14th we had a mixed social event to Nottingham Greyhound Stadium where we enjoyed a super value evening of a meal, drinks and losing money on the dogs!

This year has seen the pressures reduced for me as Mixed Captain as until this time the mixed captain had literally organised all competitions and matches. So we have created the role of match fixtures secretary and Sharon has contacted all clubs with match details leaving me to organise the teams. 1. In Memory

Sadly, earlier in the year, **Steve Tindale** passed away. Steve was Treasurer for the seniors for many years when Brian Wigley was captain of the seniors.

More recently **Peter Smart** suddenly passed away whilst on a cruise with his wife, celebrating their golden anniversary. Peter had been with the seniors for about three years and during that time made many friends with his cheerful and friendly banter.

Both are sorely missed.

2. Activities and Events

After a somewhat turbulent year last year, this year was very successful on many fronts.

- All our majors were very well attended and enjoyed. We continued to run 2 divisions, with different winners every time congratulations to all of them.
- Our Spring away day at Rutland Water was well attended, but the Autumn away day at Stoke Rochford seemed to be less popular, although enjoyed by all who participated.
- We had 29 matches during the year, winning 16, drawing 3 and losing 10. This was a big improvement on the previous year and I would like to thank all who represented the Club with distinction in these matches. Most seniors thought that we had too many matches, so we have reduced the number of our matches against other clubs to 23 for 2019.
- 2018 saw the introduction of two new events; the Seniors Club Championship and the Seniors Captain's Competition, which was a Texas Scramble. Both events were popular with good turnouts and proved very successful. Both events will now be permanent features every year.
- Other events included a matches against the Ladies and the Pounders, both of which we narrowly lost, a Halloween competition with the Ladies, and a Christmas greensomes competition, all of which were thoroughly enjoyable and successful.
- We have run monthly qualifying medals off the white tees, and stablefords off the yellow tees for the winter months. The eclectic competition is being replaced by an Order of Merit for 2019.

Course Managers Report

<u>2018</u>

As the years tick by and we continually strive to make changes and improve I have noticed the seasons are changing too. We've seen the Autumn weather and temperatures are moving increasingly toward Christmas and therefore we are now having to mow regularly well into December. Winter now doesn't usually start until the New Year! This then obviously has a knock on effect with our winter project plan and its start dates.

Last year it began just before Christmas with the releveling of the Championships 13th tees. These were originally built years ago and it had become increasingly hard to find a suitable teeing position. Whilst we were in the area we also installed a new 13th green path to help reduce wear during the winter. After the New Year the clubhouse extension began. Part of this development was the relocation and improvement of the putting green and a new 1st tee complex. I think you'll agree the old putting green was not really fit for purpose as it resembled an upturned saucer! We salvaged the old putting green turf and used it on the surface of the new ones. This helped us to provide a new surface quickly and kept continuity of the grasses with the existing greens on the courses. It was at this point winter arrived and it did it's best to stop us but we continued and even shovelled snow off the ground so we could lay turf! The project also included the planting of several new hedges which helped define the area and hid the car park. After we had finished the 1st tee we then removed an old bunker, created a new one and filled the fairway ditch further down the hole.

Whilst the clubhouse alterations were being completed the decision to upgrade the entrance to the Function Rooms was made. This included the creation of a new separate path for the golfers to use when playing the Signature Course and the planting of several new hedges to help separate guests from players.

As previously mentioned the weather had a large impact last year. It started with a significant period of snow followed by one of he coldest and wettest Springs on record. This was then followed by one of the hottest and driest summers we've known! We spent a large amount of our time moving hoses and sprinklers around in an attempt to keep vital surfaces alive. Having said all that the course held up well and we still manage to produce some good playing conditions.

By the time of this A.G.M you will have hopefully noticed we have already started this year's list of projects. This includes the upgrading of several tees on the Championship Course. Tees 5,6,9,14 and 16 are to be releveled and will have new sprinklers installed to improve the irrigation coverage. In the case of 16 we hope to move the whole complex to the left which will improve the line of sight down the hole past the Weeping Willow next to the bridge. Also we are about to complete a new path from the Signature's 12th green which will pass through the car park and up behind the driving range to the next tee. This new path will mean that you now don't have to walk into oncoming traffic arriving at the club.

As we now look forward to the forth coming season I both hope that both the weather is a little kinder to us and I can try and find time to play a little more but with an 11 year old daughter that's probably unlikely!

From the Greenkeeping team and me, thank you as always for your support and all the best for 2019.

Match & Handicap Secretary – Colin Brown

- 1. Confirmation to the membership that the M & H Committee has been compliant within the guidelines of CONGU throughout 2017 and an Annual Review against the compliance checklist has been carried out by myself.
- 2. 2017 saw the controlled and successful rollout of On-Line booking for all competitions, thereby affording all members the opportunity to enter competitions remotely and gain a tee booking appropriate to their personal needs.
- 3. In 2019 major Rule Changes are planned to take place and the M & H Committee are committed to monitor, communicate and implement the changes as appropriate.
- 4. CONGU changes for 2018 have been communicated via e-mail to members and detailed on the main noticeboard. With the introduction of Cat 5 & 6 handicaps up to the new raised limit of 54 for both men and women, the M & H Committee and as ratified by the Main Committee will restrict competitions for Men to an upper limit of 28 and for Ladies to an upper limit of 36.
- 5. Club Systems updates:
 - a. Cat 5 & 6 handicaps are now being allocated to new members based on returned scores for handicapping purposes. Those members on the upper limit of previously defined handicaps will start to see an increase in their respective handicaps as scores are returned above the competition standard scratch score.
 - b. Club Systems have introduced an improved score-sheet report whereby handicap reduction changes will be denoted on the score-sheet by the display of (R). An explanation will also appear at the bottom of the score-sheet.
 - c. The wording (NON C) will be shown next to scores of the people who are noncompetitive at the bottom of the score-sheet. With the key showing that (NON C – Not eligible for prizes)

- 6. Club Competition Rules are fully documented in the rear of the Club Diary. Members are requested to familiarize themselves with some of the changes, with particular emphasis placed on competition eligibility for match-play and club Major tournaments. Organising committees will monitor all entrants and disqualify as appropriate should the situation arise. Particular emphasis is placed on match-play events where neither party attempts to contact one another.
- 7. Section Reports. I refer to the respective Section AGM's for the M &H reports as detailed in their minutes.
- 8. Championship Course changes In view of the proposed management changes, the stroke indexes for the front nine of the men's card will be reviewed and changes will be advised as appropriate.

Colin reiterated his gratitude from all the section representatives that make up the M&H sub committee, along with the Green Staff, everyone in the office and Mike Dimblebee for his work on the Scratch team and Brian Wigley for the Combined.

His final comment was the need for succession planning for the key roles on the committee and encouraged people to think about joining the committee in the future.

enjoyed his company.

It has been a somewhat turbulent year in which there have been several changes in the personnel on the

Seniors' Committee. I took over the captaincy after Steve Wood resigned, Derek Price very kindly came out

of retirement to be Secretary after Phil Gough resigned, Graham Ayers came in to be Vice-Captain, and we

co-opted two further committee members, Garry Corpe as Fixtures Secretary and Tony Dobbs as Events

Assistant. I wish to thank those new Committee members as well as the other members, Pete Trotter,

Alistair Elliott and Rob Gray, for all their hard work in contributing towards the organisation of the many

successful events throughout the year. I would also like to thank Roger De Silva for organising the Roll-ups.

Our majors have been well supported. We have continued to run 2 divisions, with different winners every

time – congratulations to all of them. The weather was rather unkind and forced us to postpone the Dry

Summer Cup twice and the Willoughby Cup once, but we got there in the end.

Our Spring away day at Torksey was well attended, but the Autumn away day at Erewash seemed to be less

popular, although enjoyed by all who participated. We asked seniors to give their preferences for the 2018

away days and about 40 responded. We have used that feedback to choose Rutland Water for Spring and

Stoke Rochford for Autumn.

We had 32 matches during the year, winning 10, drawing 4 and losing 18. I think our end-of-year report

reads "Could do better"! Thanks to all who represented the Club in these matches, although we would like

to have a larger pool to choose from. We have reduced the number of our matches against other clubs to

29 for 2018.

We are grateful to 'Window Concepts' for providing prizes of golf balls for nearest-the-pins for our home

matches and also to one of our seniors for underwriting a prize of £100 for a hole in one (which wasn't

claimed). Having those prizes allowed us to collect £32 for every home match, which added to our collections for the charity, Maggies, to whom we were able to give £1580. Thanks to all your willing and

generous contributions to such a good cause. We are looking for a sponsor to replace Window Concepts for

2018 so if anyone has any ideas they would be welcomed.

We have run monthly qualifying medals off the white tees, and stablefords off the yellow tees for the winter

months.

We sent out a questionnaire this autumn and we were heartened by the response. 76 seniors were interested enough to voice their opinions, preferences and ideas. These responses and the Committee's

subsequent action have already been circulated to the seniors. Immediate changes are: (a) later start times for the Monday (8:00), Wednesday (7:30 after 1st Mar) and Friday (8:00) sessions.

(b) more Roll-ups (twice a month)

(c) the number of matches against other clubs has been reduced to 29 from 32 for 2018 and we are proposing to reduce this further for the 2019 season.

(d) the duration of home matches will be shortened by having a rolling lunch and by having 4 pairs starting on the 16th or 17th holes.

(e) there will be an inaugural Seniors Club Championship in October 2018 – details to be announced nearer the time.

In addition, there were several interesting suggestions that will be considered by the Committee next year.

We now have Honours Boards for the winners of the majors and the singles and doubles knockouts,

something to show your grandchildren in the future should you be so lucky, or good, or both. And lastly, an enormous thank you to the ground staff who have managed to keep the course in excellent

condition – something commented on frequently by visiting teams.

Course Superintendent – Pete Billings

It's at this time of year we can take a look back and reflect upon last years achievements and also look forward to the future.

We started 2017 by completing several winter projects on the 2 courses. Initially we started with the rebuilding of the Signatures 9th tee which required totally releveling and returfing. A new sleeper edge to the path was also installed.

After that we releveled the Signatures 10th yellows and built a raised medal tee. Whilst we were here we took the opportunity to install winter mats which enable us to play qualifying games throughout the winter. We have found that as these mats are installed as part of the permanent surface they offer a far better option than a mat just dropped on the tee top. Also while we were in that area we upgraded the path from the 15th green to the 16th tee past the bell.

Next on the list was the shortening of the Championships 12th tee for the gents. It was deemed to be too difficult with you having to negotiate your ball to the green past a bunker and a pond from 200 yds away. The decision was made to extend and relevel the existing yellow tee by 25yds which makes it far more playable.

Winter then turned to Spring and thoughts changed to the forth coming season. An area of reoccurring concern has been the height and density of the semi rough throughout both courses. A decision was made that it would be reduced in height to 50mm and be cut more often. Also the length of grass between some of the holes was causing concern. It was considered a big enough penalty being in there without the added penalty of possibly losing your ball! Our present semi rough machine wasn't capable of this so a new contour mower was duly sourced and bought. The rest of the summer remained largely uneventful, in a good way!! The playing surfaces continued to improve and were well received by members and visitors alike.

The Autumn greens maintenance was to be the next major operation where we managed to work 150 tons of sand into the greens surface. The results of this work can now be appreciated as the surfaces are still great at this time of year.

We on the ground staff have increasing noticed that the Autumn season has extended further into Winter which then requires us to continue with a full mowing programme well into November. Historically winter projects would have been in full flow by then. The results of this are that we didn't start any projects this year until December.

The Championships 13th tee was our first port of call with the yellow and red tees requiring a new level surface. The bridge to these tees also needed replacing. The medal tee will be done also in the near future. A new path has also recently been completed leading you from the 13th approach past the half way house to the 14th tees. This has been done in order to prevent wear damage to the surround on the left hand side of the green. As we enter 2018 you will have obviously noticed the next project! After much deliberation between Kimber Golf Architects and ourselves we are in the process of creating 2 new putting greens which has always been a weak point in the facilities here. Also a new 1st tee complex is being made for both the ladies and gents. The ditch half way down the fairway is to be filled, a new bunker on the left of the fairway and the removal of the existing one on the right. No one can say we stand still here and I think it will make a significant improvement to our present layout.

With all that's planned its going to be a busy few months and on behalf of my team and me I wish you all well for the forthcoming season.

Managing Director – Bill McKenzie

As this is now my 6th year at the Club it is, as ever, a pleasure to report on another successful year in

2017 but also to reflect on the evolution of the Club and the complex in general.

The weather has been reasonably good to us, the two courses have played extremely well and it seems like everyone has enjoyed their golfing experiences at the Nottinghamshire, even though the scores may not have always been as good as what most of us wanted but that's Golf isn't it.

The face of the complex here at the Nottinghamshire is continually changing, hopefully for the better of course. The owner and I are constantly in discussions re how we can make the overall cradle to grave experience of arriving and parking up, playing the course and eating or drinking at our complex as enjoyable as possible for everyone.

At this point in time we both feel it is appropriate to reiterate that the significant investment in both

courses and the clubhouse itself has only been possible by developing the more hospitality side of the business.

Members of other clubs, and this is anywhere in the UK by the way, would struggle to find another golf course complex that has had so much money spent on it to improve it for the Members. Alan has invested well over £4 million on just the 2 courses and the clubhouse over the last 6 years and this is unprecedented in this industry over these last few years. One would be mistaken to assume that this investment has paid back yet as it will be at least 10 years before Alan sees a tangible return

for his money.

Here is a list off some of the improvements/investments:

In 2012 the Clubhouse received a £2 million refurbishment which provided one of the most comfortable clubhouse facilities in the Midlands. Since then a glass Terrace has been added to give Members more seating.

Isignificantly redesigning numerous holes on both courses has made a huge difference re how the courses look and play which has cost well over £1 million.

I Changing the Signature layout has ensured a much better balanced round with a spectacular finish.

Several tees have been revamped and more are to be done before the season starts in April 2018.

The regular and expensive investment in new course machinery, over £500k, has paid off brilliantly with our fairways and greens never been in better condition, especially as we play through the winter whilst many other courses are closed.

We are delighted that the vast majority of our valued membership are able to work out that the only

way of finding such high amounts of investment is to develop the weddings, functions and Hotel side

of the business to help pay for these improvements. Golf on its own would never be able to provide the return on such a high level of investment.

Membership numbers, as in the rest of the UK, remain a challenge with current numbers at only 885. This is clearly an average of only 442 per course versus the normal average of 650-700 for a Nottinghamshire single course complex. The majority of our local Clubs also enjoy no VAT being charged as they are private Members clubs whilst we pay the VAT man 20% on everything. So the fact that we are well short of the normal numbers means we can find plenty room for some societies

and Members can enjoy the variety our 2 courses provide as well as get a game reasonably comfortably. On this item it is worth reminding the Membership that those people who consistently

don't turn up for a tee time they have booked in advance, cause other Members to miss out on a getting a game. We will be noting those offenders in 2018 and taking appropriate action to ensure this practice stops.

As I have already written to you all regarding the reasons for the 2.5% increase on fees for 2018 I will

summarise this one by reinforcing the facts that the Government increases for minimum pay rates has forced us to find at least some of this money via the 2.5% we are charging. This represents a total income of only £13,000 which doesn't even cover the extra pay increases never mind pay for any of the Machinery investment or course improvements planned for 2018. So what are the plans for 2018?

At this point in time we are a little bit in limbo as we wait for both the Planning permission for clubhouse developments we are considering as well as the plans from our course architect Paul Kimber regarding the course changes under review. These plans include potentially relocating the pro shop into the courtyard and refurbishing the pro shop into a lovely lounge bar space for members to enjoy. I can confirm that the 3 holes under consideration include the 1st and 4th holes on

the Championship as well as the 6th hole on the signature. I promise that we will share the detail once we get the plans back from Paul in the very near future.

We are also looking at a plan to improve and flatten the existing putting green. Finally we are working on a plan to extend the driving range to put in 2 indoor teaching bays with a golf simulator and toilets which will be available for Members passing on their way to the 13th tee. As ever, these plans are always subject to change due to circumstances outside our control, but at least you are now aware of our intentions.

On the management team front and to reemphasise our commitment to improving the service to our Members, we have appointed Sara Gacem, who is here tonight, as our new General Manager.

Sara, who already has wealth of hospitality experience from working around the world will be spending a lot of time getting to know what your needs are and learning how to improve your food and beverage experience so please feel free to chat to her as she walks around the Clubhouse. On a Committee front, I want to pay tribute to Chris Curzon, our Club Captain and also to Aileen Kynoch our Ladies Captain. Both Captains have had a great year, both in the way they have conducted themselves and how they have represented the Club. They have also raised massive amounts of money for the Maggie's charity which is a brilliant effort. Well done and thank you to both. I look forward to working just as closely with the 2018 Captains Joe and Carol. Good luck to you both.

Finally, as we have numerous other Captains and Committee members who work tirelessly to ensure

competitions and teams all run smoothly, we want to say a huge thanks to all those who volunteer their valuable time to support our Club. This is helped in no small way with how Colin Brown and his helpers, administer our competitions and handicaps in such an effective way on a daily basis. Thank you Colin we really appreciate your commitment.

Thank you for your attention and have a fantastic year in 2018.

Financial Commentary

- 4. Income from competition entry fees exceeded £23,000 and was up by approximately £2000 on the previous year, due mainly to fewer competitions being cancelled for bad weather.
- 5. The budget plan for the year, as with recent previous years, was to "break-even". However, actual expenditure exceeded income by £987 resulting in a reduction of the cash surplus held. The single largest overspend was in the category of Social Events and was due to the decision made by the Committee to increase spending on celebrating the 25th anniversary of the club.
- 6. The budget for 2017/18 has once again been set to roughly balance expenditure to income.

Treasurer Notes

Given that, at any one time, the Committee is responsible for holding around £6,000 of members' funds in the form of balances on competition accounts, it is crucial that we maintain suitable procedures for securing and reconciling these funds. I can confirm that, once again, the member competition balances maintained on the ClubV1 system have been regularly reconciled throughout the year against the accounts system and the bank statements and that no irregularities have been identified.

I reported last year that Ash Stephenson had been appointed as the new auditor for Committee financial records and I would like to thank Ash for his input during the year to the Finance Liaison meetings along with the Hon Sec and myself.
