#### What Happens Next

We will now forward your details to our administration office in South India, which is responsible for allocating children to sponsors. They will be in touch with you shortly with details of your sponsored child, including an initial child profile and photograph.

## Receiving Information from India

#### Your Child's Name



Every child has a given name preceded by an initial, which represents his father's name, for example *K.Muthupandi*. This is how his name will appear on reports. However if you were speaking or writing to him, he would simply be addressed as "*Muthupandi*".

The initial shows that while K.Muthupandi and K.Shanmurugan might well be brothers, K.Muthupandi and R.Muthupandi are not.

### What can I expect as a sponsor?

The school year in Tamil Nadu begins on the first Monday in June, and admissions to the projects fall in line with that. Volunteers will initially meet the newcomers and write their personal profiles.



The children will usually send greetings to their sponsors in late summer, once they have settled down at school. During the year further greetings will be sent in late November (Diwali) and for Pongal (January harvest).

At the end of each school year (April/May) you will receive a report describing the events of the last twelve months in the project where the child is being cared for, together with a recent photograph.

The exact timing of any communication will depend on project work being undertaken and the translation resources available.

#### **Understanding Information from India**

Most of the reports you receive, including Child Profiles and Annual Reports, will be written by English-speaking volunteers. However the greetings cards and/or letters you may receive are written by the children, often with help from project staff.

The English used in India differs in some respects from the UK and misunderstandings can occur. All the children we support attend schools where they are taught in their native language. They learn English as a second language from the age of 10 years. Some do very well, but others only reach a rudimentary level of achievement. For this reason letters from children, although personalised and individual, will often have been translated into English by project staff and volunteers. All our own staff speak English, however while project staff often speak some English, few can write English. All communications will come via the Charity's India office.


#### **UK Newsletter**

All mail received will be checked by our Indian staff to ensure that each letter is forwarded to the correct child. Please note we do not reveal sponsors addresses to the children or their families under any circumstances.

#### Can I send a gift?

There is no obligation to send gifts however should you wish to send a little treat, a small donation sent via our Peterborough office is preferable. This allows us to purchase something to benefit all children in a project, such as a new game or even a special cake and a few sweets.

Any individual gift should only be sent direct to our India office for a special occasion (such as a birthday) and be modest in value.



#### Can I meet my sponsored child?



If you would like to meet your sponsored child during a visit to India, this can be arranged, provided sufficient notice is given. Remember children are in school during the week, and visits must be by prior arrangement with project management. Please contact the Peterborough office for further information.

## About the Boys Towns, Girls Towns, and Children's Villages

The first of Joe Homan's Boys Towns was founded in 1964. Today, JHC working with different NGO's supports 6 Boys Towns, 3 Girls Towns and 3 Children's Villages, between them assisting 850 children each year. Each one is a community of about 70 Youngsters, all of whom come from poor families who cannot afford to educate them.



The majority of the boys in each Boys Town attend the local Government Higher Secondary School. They normally join at about 12 (Grade 6) and stay until Grade 10 (at age 16 - the equivalent of GCSE).

Vocational Guidance is given to all youngsters - those who are academically able will be encouraged to continue into higher education, while others will be guided towards accredited training most suited to their individual skills.

In the Girls Towns more emphasis is placed on higher education, so that the girls can apply for positions as secretaries, teachers and nurses. By law certain jobs have quotas for women, including 50% of all government jobs, and we help them get to the necessary academic level for application.





The Children's Villages are mixed projects for boys and girls under the age of 12 in need of care. Each one has 12 bungalows, all of which are run by foster mothers. Like the Boys Towns and the Girls Town, each Children's Village has about 70 children.

Links with their families: We encourage strong links to be maintained if at all possible. The children go home for the normal school holidays, and for family and village festivals. Twice a year, parents' weekends are held with sports, entertainment, exhibitions or work and discussions. At the end of schooling children rejoin their families and we aim to make this as smooth a transition as possible.

The Boys and Girls Towns are happy places with a strong community spirit. There is regular opportunity to join in leisure activities as well as having the chance of an education to benefit them in later years.

The best way to help The Joe Homan Charity is to tell others about the children and how we help them. Your own enthusiasm can be powerful and extremely infectious.




Show people the cards, letters, and photographs, you receive from your sponsored child in India or Thailand, and share your joy in their progress.
