No entry fees or cash prizes

Judges' decisions are final. The schedule must be adhered to in order to avoid disqualification

A maximum of two entries per person per class and a competitor is only eligible to win one certificate per class.

All exhibits to be staged between 8:30am and 10:30am on the morning or the show. No late entries will be accepted.

The show tent must be cleared by 11:00am on the morning of the show when judging will commence.

Exhibits must not be removed until after completion of prize giving. The organisers cannot take responsibility for any exhibits not collected from the show tent by 6:00pm.

The organisers cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to any exhibitor's property.
