

Weather situation overview for the UK & Ireland for Sunday

On Sunday, high pressure lies to the south of Britain, centred around Biscay. A trough of low pressure and fronts move across northern regions, bringing a spell of rain. A cold front passes south-eastwards across Britain into the evening and night, and pressure will then build from the south-west. Generally cloudy throughout the day, and very dull, especially in the west. Some brighter skies toward the southeast. Blustery winds, strongest in the north.

Short term forecast for this afternoon

Cloudy skies for *this afternoon* in the Wombourne area. Light rain is expected. Temperatures will be around 7C, and the wind is expected to be north-westerly and blowing around 24 mph, with gusts to 28mph.

Short term forecast for this evening

By *this evening* skies will be cloud and dry weather is being forecast. Temperatures will be around 6C, and the wind will be to be northwesterly at a speed of around 16 mph, with gusts to 24mph.

Planning outlook:


Monday A fairly quiet day overall as high pressure resides across the British Isles. Some lingering fog patches in central and soutuhern areas, which may keep things chilly. Murky around western coasts, with low cloud and patchy drizzle, although amounts small. Some hazy sunshine, best toward the east & north-east. Winds variable F3-F4 or locally less; S-SW F4-F5 west, or F6 far north-west.

Tuesday High pressure lies toward the south of Britain. Generally mild. A lot of cloud, especially in the west. Patchy drizzly rain for western coasts and hills, but amounts mostly small. Some more persistent rain will move into western Scotland & Ireland. Brightest skies toward the east of Britain, with some sunshine. Winds SW F4-F5 south, F5-F6 north, or F7-F8 Western & Northern Isles.


Wednesday Fronts trailing in from the Atlantic will run across northern Britain, bringing outbreaks of rain or drizzle. Over hills in the north-west, it may turn into a very wet day. Cloudy for most places. Some brightness in eastern Scotland. Winds SW F4-F5 south, F6 north, risk F7. **Thursday** A weakening front sinks southwards, bringing cloudy and damp conditions to central-southern England, but it should stay mild here. Murkiest in the south-west. Brighter toward the north. A few showers will affect western Scotland. Winds W veering locally NW, F4-F6. **Friday** Staying fairly mild, although temperatures lower than midweek, especially in the north. A general weaterly flow, with high pressure centred south of Britain. Patchy rain or drizzle, mostly in the west. Winds variable F3-F4 south, S-SW F5-F6 north.

Saturday Fronts moving in from the Atlantic bring a threat of rain to north-western Britain & Ireland, whilst the south & east should stay largely dry. Winds SW F3-F4 south, F5-F7 north.


Synoptic updated at 13:30 Sun 17 December 2017 (Updated daily) Tomorrow (Day 2)




Day after tomorrow (Day 3)




